




ANNUAL REPORT 2021/22 SEASON

5. To affiliate with SLSA or such other association or body from time to time responsible for the administration of Surf Life Saving in Australia and with such similar State and/or District Associations as may be necessary or considered desirable by the Committee.
6. To arrange youth activities and functions for members.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

On behalf of the Executive and General Committee, I am pleased to present the 111th Annual Report for your consideration and adoption.

This report documents the activities of the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the 2021-2022 Season and includes the Audited Financial Statement and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April 2022.

The last Annual General Meeting was held on 31st October 2021. Members of the Executive elected were Greg Broome, Mark Anderson, Liz Green, Stuart Spencer, Andrew Sole and Craig Thomas.

Patrols

The season was quite different this year due not only to the global COVID-19 pandemic and local restrictions/public health orders changing quite frequently, but also to considerable weather events with water again lapping at the beach-side roller doors, a tsunami alert, and a few shark sightings across the beaches that put a hold to beachgoers, Nippers' water and training events.

Patrols were diligent on Collaroy Beach and congratulations to all patrolling members for maintaining a safe beach with no major incidents to report. Volunteers patrolled on Christmas Day and on the State and Australian Titles' weekends. Thanks to Club Captain, Liz Green and her team for maintaining this tradition at Collaroy.

Competition

This season saw the continuation of new competition formats in place, designed to reduce the overall attendance numbers to within government specified limits. The State Titles at Queenscliff were effectively cancelled due to weather conditions affecting water quality, and subsequent lack of beach. Collaroy ended up hosting nine competition days over an eight-week period between mid-January and mid-March – Branch Titles, for Age, Masters and Open Beach, and R&R, Young Guns boats and as back-up beach for several boat carnivals including Branch, ASRL and Ocean Thunder.

There was a late change to Queensland for the Aussies, which added to the challenges of planning competition attendance. The Australian Titles did however progress, and Collaroy enjoyed successes across the events. Section reports and competition

results attest to this.

The results of this season's carnivals are presented later in the report. Well done to everyone who competed, whether you gained a medal, made the finals, or helped make a team.

Branch

Collaroy was recognised at the Branch Awards of Excellence as overall winner of the Bennett Board Open Carnival Handicap Point Score, receiving a Bennett racing mal. Two boat crews won their premiership divisions, and three club members were recognised with service awards. Collaroy members continue to support Branch through BOEA, BOSS panels, and Support Operations on RWC and the TIPS program.

Community Service

The Club was involved in limited community service events during the year, again due to gathering restrictions in place that curtailed the number of fundraising events on the calendar.

Dedicated club members coordinated the 'Sea Turtles' programme, allowing those less-abled in the community to enjoy the ocean pool and surf in a supervised environment. The club also supported and raised funds for Head Above Water 24 Hours Swim event.

Our core community service is conducted September through April, via our core business of patrol teams on the beach. It's great to see our patrolling members active on the beach, engaging public, providing tips or information in response to public questions, and the preventative actions to encourage public safety whilst at Collaroy. Surf lifesaving is very well regarded in that respect.

All in all, another very busy and fruitful year of continued community support.

Functions

Our annual Golf Day was held in January and The Annual Life and Distinguished Service Members' Luncheon held in April, with both being successful. The luncheon was highlighted by an engaging presentation by Sean Brawley, author of our club book 'Vigilant and Victorious', about changing research techniques and new findings about our surf club history.

The Club was used for several functions, for internal club events,

members' functions, SNB Branch and other external events.

The venue at Collaroy was operated under ever changing restrictions placed on us by Public Health Orders, and well done to Luke, Kate and team for the work they have put in and managing under challenging and changing conditions.

Nippers

Our junior members have had another great season, particularly dealing with varied conditions on Sundays. They have been successful at Branch carnivals and at the State Age (U9-12) Titles held at Queenscliff beach. Unfortunately, the Youth Titles (U13-15) was not completed due to conditions.

We again congratulate the Nippers on the Christmas initiative of a toy appeal for the children and families who are less fortunate, with a donation of gifts to the Children's Hospital. To Craig and his committee, congratulations on a great year under trying conditions.

Sponsorship

The club has been fortunate to retain existing and secure new, valuable sponsorship in a tough climate during the last season. Thanks are extended to the sponsorship team and dedicated, industrious work of members in bringing sponsorship to fruition.

Club members are encouraged to support the community and our sponsors listed in the report.

Conclusion

Thank you to the Executive and all our club committees for their support and hard work, often behind the scenes, in what has been another very unusual season due to the pandemic and varied weather conditions.

As noted each year, to all patrolling members, competitors and officials who have carried on the proud tradition of representing Collaroy with distinction, thank you.

CLUB AWARDS 2020 - 2021

Distinguished Service Membership

Two club members were awarded Distinguished Service Membership at the 2021 AGM.



Scott Macqueen

Scott joined the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club at 15 years, during 1990, and immediately completed his Surf Life Saving (S.L.S.) Certificate. He obtained his Surf Life Saving Bronze in 1991.

I guess the old adage of "once a boatie always a boatie" can draw parallels with Scott. Having watched his father (Collaroy Life Member) Rod Macqueen compete at all levels and witnessed the enjoyment he and his teammates derived from this passion, it is not surprising Scott was drawn to this division of the surf lifesaving fraternity.

Over the years, Scott has taken on every available role within the surf boat section and been a driving force in its development along the way.

- Boat Captain and Committee Member 2005-2007
- Such is his commitment to the surf boat fraternity, Scott achieved Boat Sweep and Accreditation in 2009 – to assist the many youngsters wishing to join and to maintain development of this section of the club
- 2017 – accredited surf boat coach
- 2018 – gained Level 3 Surf Boat Sweep accreditation
- Eight accreditation awards culminating in the receipt of the Association 25-year Long Service Award in 2019, an

endorsement of his commitment.

On the competition side of our movement, Scott has achieved considerable success both as a rower and boat sweep at World Titles, Australian Titles, N.S.W. State, Branch and Australian Surf Boat Rowers League (A.S.R.L.). Within these competitions and whilst too numerous to mention individually, with his teammates as a rower and a sweep, he has won thirty medals – comprising nine gold, ten silver and eleven bronze medals, with a gold medal in the U/21 boat race at the 1996 World Titles worthy of mention.

Away from competition, in his quiet way Scott has involved himself in other club activities –

- He was responsible for the implementation and management of the club website, approaching his contacts to obtain a \$30K sponsorship from Lateral Systems to cover the cost. He set up the club "Facebook" page in 2013 and managed it for almost ten years.
- Over a long period of time, he has been responsible for the creative artwork for various surf club projects – website; touring team apparel; annual reports; club invitations; surf boat and
- club equipment signage and sponsorship proposals.
- As a result of the recent drought, Scott initiated, co-ordinated and led the "Boaties Big Food Drop", which collected a significant amount of food, luxury items and monetary donations which were distributed to needy families in drought-stricken Dubbo. With this initiative, the team filled four surf boats and headed west.
- More recently and due to the pandemic, Scott donated hand sanitiser and dispensers to the club and specifically the gym, to ensure the club remained compliant with regulations. This was so successful that as part of the club's hand hygiene regime, dispensers are now located in all prominent areas of the surf club.



Clive Thompson

During the 2005-06 season, Clive joined the Collaroy Surf Club from North Narrabeen, where he had been a patrolling member and Patrol Captain.

Upon transfer, he took on the role of IRB Captain almost immediately and for the next six years, ensured the IRBs were maintained in meticulous condition. For almost fifteen years in conjunction with his beach protection, Clive's sole focus was the IRB section, where he assisted the various patrol captains, organised numerous training sessions and promoted the IRB in recruitment drives. His 100% commitment ensured Collaroy could provide members the opportunity to train as drivers and crew. The club could then fulfil duty when called upon in competition or rescue.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES BOARD “NIPPERS”

A great season for the Nippers. Once again Covid had an impact, delaying our start to the season due to restrictions and not allowing us to hold our normal winter training sessions. Fingers crossed we have seen the back of the disruptions.

As well as Covid, we didn't get the rub of the green when it came to weather and surf conditions on Sundays, I think I could count the good days on one hand! We had torrential rain, pollution, huge surf, storms, debris on the beach and even the threat of a tsunami, that said we did make the most of every day we did get.

As mentioned at the end of my 2020/21 report we were lucky to have the addition of some new faces on the committee and a couple of new Age Managers all of whom were fantastic support throughout the season. An experienced registrar, the team of ladies looking after clothing were great, very proactive, and keen to push the sales. It was great to have the BBQ back, the smell of the onions and snags cooking was missed!! The guys in the BBQ didn't stop turning sausages all season, opening early, closing late and often selling out. Our rookie Age Managers U6 & U8's were a hit with the kids, always enthusiastic, creating fun and engaging the parents while delivering a great program.

We continued with the split start times, this again allowed the younger kids to have valuable time in the pool before the swim club arrived, allowing the Age Managers to concentrate on swimming and survival skills, the kids gaining valuable confidence in the water and getting to spend some time on nipper boards. When the conditions allowed, it was great to see groups being tested in the shore break while having heaps of fun, supported by their parents getting wet while assisting the Age Managers.

When we could, we had the older kids in the ocean, training, testing, and honing their surf and rescue skills. Those kids

not in the water worked on their beach sprinting, flags and tug of war, the U9's & U10's have great numbers and some really enthusiastic competitors, it will be great to see these groups develop over the next couple of seasons. On one of the mornings when the forecast was not the best along with the surf conditions, we held a training morning. After a well-received Eco/Surf education talk from one of our Age Managers (Tristan) we split the kids into groups and took them through, General First Aid, CPR, Radios and gave them a full tour of the club, introducing them to areas they can aspire to be part of.

Throw all the disruptions I have mentioned into the mix, these didn't help with carnivals, there were only a couple of water and beach carnivals before the Branch Championships. Branch Water survived and we had some great results and huge efforts across all age groups. Collaroy hosted the Branch Beach and again the kids did well across all age groups, in the short and long-distance events. State is always a highlight for me, no matter the weather or conditions and it didn't fail to deliver, we had rain and more rain! Muddy water and messy challenging surf!! We moved tents and moved them again!! But the kids didn't complain, they never stopped smiling, they competed well, made friends as they waited to race, had fun, and did the Red Cap proud.

PREMISES COMMITTEE REPORT

Following the AGM, the members of the Premises Committee remained unchanged from the 2020-2021 season - Gerry Cooney (Secretary), Doug Patrick, Graham Hart, Darryl Gilmartin, Steve Green, Tyler Stowe and Geoff Small (Chairman).

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic again disrupting our surf season, for the second year, the AGM was postponed from early August to late October, thus reducing the season to just nine months.

Projects mentioned as in the pipeline in last year's report and now complete were –

- Removal of the lounge carpet and replacement with a timber floating floor. This was very much affected by the isolation areas during the pandemic as the contractors, located in Western Sydney, were interrupted by three months. Thankfully, the job was completed by Christmas and the new floor has added to the ambience of the lounge and made for easier cleaning. Whilst we had all the approvals for the \$8K project, Sponsorship Officer Barry Muncke was able to obtain a government grant to cover the entire cost, removing our reliance on club funds and freeing monies for other club necessities.
- The parquet flooring in the main hall was completely rejuvenated in November. The repairs and replacements, sanding and polyurethane finish were completed by Pittwater Eco-Flooring. Whilst the floor can be refreshed in a couple of years with a recoat, its seventy years' service will not allow further sanding of the timber and will require replacement in due course. However, with care, it should last another twenty years before this becomes necessary.



- Our previous premises lease expired during August 2020. Due to Covid-19 and the State Governments' desire for a generic lease with a separate attached sheet noting clubs' specific individual requirements when situated on crown land, formulation of this lease has taken a considerable amount of time for legal representatives from Northern Beaches Council, NSW Government and Sydney Northern Beaches Branch to be in complete agreement. President Greg Broome and I met with Northern Beaches Council representatives and CEO Ray Brownlee on November 1st, 2021, when the clubs' next twenty-year lease was signed. The first in the state to do this, our new lease comes into effect from July 1st, 2022.
- Northern Beaches Council installed four CCTV cameras around the building a few years ago, but we were not made aware of the clubs' responsibility for their maintenance. Despite an expression of disappointment, we are in the process of obtaining quotes for these cameras to be maintained and their connection to the recently purchased computer.
- Kenyon is monitoring the clubs electronic keying (fob) system. It is the club requirement for all eligible members requiring easy access to the building, gym, first aid room, to have a fob. This will enable monitoring by the administrators of building security, gym movement and financial status of the holders. We are grateful to Kenyon for his patient assistance in the teething problems associated with this new system.
- Solar power system. It is unfortunate that the continual roof leaks have meant council request to delay this installation of thirty panels. Two years of extensive research throughout Australia in ascertaining the best solar system for our environment and needs plus quote gaining by Gerry Cooney, granting of approvals and application of a grant offsetting the cost enabled us to be ready last December. Once approval is granted by council to proceed, we can authorise AG. (formerly EPHO Solar Systems Pty Ltd) to commence installation. This is now tentative for June 1st and once up and running, will reduce our electricity bill by \$10,000 per annum. As frustrating as this has been, the Premises Committee would like to express its appreciation for the patience and professionalism which AGL has shown to the

club over these past months.

Projects on hold due principally to lack of council funding and the results of the pandemic and summer storms which hit the Northern Beaches causing major damage throughout the area.

- Painting of the building
- Extension of the gym eastern wall
- Proposed balcony at the northern end of the building

Acknowledgements –

- Our thanks to Kerrie and David MacIntosh for storing all our framed photographs and large Honour Boards for more than twenty years. These will soon be documented by photograph for posterity. Discussions have been ongoing as to a suitable permanent storage location for the these and the many historical items currently in the club or members' homes factories etc. We are also looking at ways of utilising modern electronic technology, getting the photos out of boxes where they currently reside and store them on a screen for members to view and enjoy as they desire.
- I would thank Darryl Gilmartin and his company DJG Carpentry for the work done to repair the damage at the end of the eastern wall of the lounge and repairing the wall in the boat shed. On behalf of the club Darryl compiled a detailed report for council on the state of the roof of which the result was the replacement of the roof late last year.
- Our thanks are extended to Jamie Crichton of JKC signwriting who looks after the majority of our signwriting at the club, especially all the detailed work required on our Honour Boards in the lounge, the club Sponsors and Donors board plus the extensive signwriting as required on our new Surf Boats.
- We express our gratitude to gym and club member Kieran Gavin and his wife Sue, who generously supply our caretakers with cleaning products and other requested items. Such is their generosity and enthusiasm; they assist the club in many other ways which I expect will be addressed by other section leaders in their reports.
- To the Blue Oysters and the other mid-week gym users as a

collective group of exercise fanatics (and coffee drinkers!), thanks for the manner in which you care for the gym and for the pride evident by all in keeping the area clean and tidy.

- To the facilities team at Northern Beaches Council who are responsible for the upkeep of our building and with whom your Premises Committee work well with, on both areas of the club requiring attention also with advice on matters principally involving the building. To Nigel Hart, Donald Gibson, Greg Baker, Brian Eastbourn and Peter Rodham and we say thank you for the prompt manner in which repairs have been carried out. To those members who are not sure of the protocol, as per our lease, we as a club are responsible for the constant maintenance and upkeep of the building's interior and Northern Beaches Council look after the exterior.
- Within officialdom of local, state and federal governments, funding by grants is allocated for a wide range of items. Sponsorship Officer Barry Muncke, Treasurer Stuart Spencer and Premises Secretary Gerry Cooney diligently peruse the available papers and must be admired for the manner in which they make known to the club those grants which are applicable, thus saving us several thousand dollars a year. Specifically, Gerry has obtained \$5K to date toward the solar power project and as mentioned earlier in this report Barry an \$8K grant which completely paid for the new timber lounge floor – many thanks to you both.
- Thanks to Greg Broome and the General Committee for your continued support of projects, repairs and all matters undertaken on behalf of the membership. A special mention to Club Treasurer Stu Spencer for his financial guidance, grant interpretation, communication and unwavering support of our projects.

In conclusion – Many thanks to our caretakers Jon Hynes and Amy Ryniker for their continual commitment to ongoing cleaning, security, and maintenance of the premises. Prominent anti-social behaviour sees graffiti often on the building and equipment. Prompt notification by Amy to council ensures a ready response. Your efforts are appreciated by the committee and the membership.

To all members of this years' Premises Committee – Gerry, Doug, Tyler, Graham, Steve, Darryl Gilmartin, and Greg Broome, thanks for your willingness to be involved. We are a very diverse group of individuals with particular skills who work well for the club, providing expertise to ensure the club and premises is a pleasant environment for the members. Whilst the surf year was a little shorter, we achieved a lot. We have projects ahead which will ensure the Premises Committee is never idle.

OBITUARIES

This past season witnessed the passing of three members including one Life Member (who was our oldest member), a Distinguished Service Member (who was perhaps our greatest water competitor), a Senior Associate Member (who was also an Australian Rugby League Representative) and a member's wife who for over fifty years was a great club supporter.

All contributed in their own special manner to the betterment of the surf club. As I have highlighted in previous annual reports a situation I continually encounter as I research their unique individual stories, with the passing of these respected members and friends, there also goes part of the history of times past and links in our 111-year history.

Our deepest sympathy is extended to the families and friends of our late members.

Graeme BRUCE

On Saturday, 7th August 2021, we lost our oldest member when Life Member Graeme Bruce passed away peacefully at his home within the Wesley retirement village in Manly, aged 98 years.

Graeme joined the club as a junior and obtained his Surf Bronze in January of 1945. Coming from a school rowing background

with Sydney Grammar, it wasn't long before he was rowing in the Junior Boat crew, where in their first carnival they won the prestigious Junior Boat Race at the Metropolitan Championships for all Sydney Clubs at Manly.

He was such a skilful rower that senior members of the club saw him being in contention for a seat in the Senior Boat crew. He was involved in a row-off with a fellow rower Jim Dawson, and managed to so impress the remaining crew and selectors with his technique and stamina, that he became a permanent member of the crew. As it would turn out, Graeme secured a place in Collaroy history when in 1946 they won the Australian Open Boat Title in huge seas at Maroubra Beach. Unfortunately, with his other crew mates already departed, Graeme was the last surviving member of this victorious crew.

Not only was it the first open boat title which a Collaroy crew had won, but despite countless attempts and many minor placings, so elusive is this title it remains the only time it has been with Collaroy in 75 years.

Graeme was our club's Boat Captain for five years from 1963 – 1968.

In the 2010 - 2011 season, the club named their new surf boat "The Bruiser" in honour of Graeme and in recognition of his

dedicated service to the club over many decades. The boat is still in service today and many of our current boating fraternity members have rowed and competed in the boat.

Whilst there is no doubt that Graeme's first love was surf boats, reflecting an interest in the growing sport of surfboards, in 1946 he became our club's first Surf Board Captain.

Due to the limited number of members at carnivals, those who had even minimal ability, style or technique were expected to march. This Graeme and his rowing mates did with panache. Perhaps attempting to set a trend by shying away from the standard March Past uniform as we know it, on December 3rd, 1946, they took to the beach at the Manly Carnival and competed in the March Past event shirtless, in matching dapper white shorts - never seen before nor indeed since!

It is worth noting that Graeme was born and bred in Collaroy as his father Dr Herbert Bruce had a General Practice on Pittwater Road in Collaroy. In 1925, his father became one of our first Honorary Medical Officers, a role he held for several years.

The linkage is ironic in that fellow 1946 crewmate Pat Armstrong's son, Dr Michael Armstrong, OAM, has followed in Dr Bruce's footsteps and is currently our club's Honorary Medical Officer, a role he has filled for us since 1978. Our current club patron Betty Twights' late husband Dick, was the crews' sweep.

For his services to the Club, Graeme was awarded Collaroy Life Membership at the 1968 AGM.

The current COVID-19 restrictions mean that Graeme's funeral will be limited to family only and invited guests, as only ten may be in attendance.

Due to this situation, Graeme's daughter Robyn, has asked the club if a Memorial Service could be held at the club when restrictions are eased. Hopefully, this will be before Christmas and include the scattering of both Graeme and his late wife Judith's ashes, utilising "The Bruiser" surf boat.

The club have unanimously agreed to this request and in due course you will all be advised of the date. We will then be able to join together as we farewell a true club man, a thorough gentleman who had a marvellous sense of humour, a zest for life and one who just loved to tell the odd story or two.


All at his retirement village knew of Graeme's love of the club and Surf Life Saving in general. They knew how he looked forward to receiving his invite to attend the Annual Life Member Luncheon in January, where he could enjoy the camaraderie by spending the afternoon reminiscing and sharing a laugh with his mates. He was able to do this until a year or two ago, when mobility became an issue.

Graeme is survived by his two children, Robyn and David, their partners, six grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

It would be a fair statement to make in saying that the Collaroy Surf Club and the Surf Life Saving movement was in his blood and the movement is poorer for his passing.

Ian (Inky) Grant MONTGOMERY



Ian (Inky) Montgomery passed away following surgical complications in a Melbourne Hospital on Tuesday, 30th November, 2021, aged 69 years. Ian was an excellent member and one of Collaroy's finest surf swimmers

During the late 60's and through the 70's, a time when many clubs had excellent swimmers in their ranks, the Collaroy Surf Club had perhaps the finest collective group of swimmers of any surf club for any competition throughout Australia. Inky played a major part in the club's success during this period.

Inky joined the club as a Cadet in 1966 and obtained his Surf Bronze Medallion on June, 18th 1967 (number, N16656). Keen to have a go at anything with his mates, he would enjoy the camaraderie over many years in the R&R event. As it was the early days of the Iron Man being included in competition, he enjoyed that event too. However, it was in the surf that he truly excelled.

During the club's seventy-five-year dinner celebrations during August of 1986, Ian was one of eleven to receive the inaugural "Distinguished Service Award" for services to the club.

In the immediate time following his demise, all past and present members to whom I spoke who knew and who competed alongside Inky, sang the praises of a man who was not the best swimmer in the club but highly regarded by his team mates and fellow competitors as one of the finest body surfers our sport has seen.

Some of the comments offered include – "his long lean body enabled him to turn a ripple into a wave"; "before the wave had peaked Inky was one of the best green water wave catchers around"; "completely fearless - would take and ride any wave"; "relished big surf and was one of the best surf readers around"; "whilst not the best swimmer, he would pass swimmers with his wave riding ability"; "not only coming home was he without peer - as he was taught by Dick Twilight, he would study the surf before his event and put his long legs to use wading and using any sandbank to his advantage on heading to the cans."

His Representative Honours are very impressive, as this condensed list indicates:

- 1969 - Most Outstanding Junior
- 1972 and 1973 - Most Outstanding Member
- 4 times NSW State Representative
- 9 times Branch Representative
- Over 10 medals of all colours won at Aussies in Surf, Belt and Surf Teams races.
- Perhaps most significant being that along with Mike Bradford he was a member in each of their three in a row wins at the Aussies in the Open Surf Teams race.
- Over 10 medals of all colours won at NSW State Championships in Surf, Belt and Surf Teams races.
- Over 30 medals won in all colours at Branch Championships in Iron Man, Surf, Belt, Surf Teams and Surf Board races.
- A great supporter of club events and our Club Championships, over a few years Inky won over 30 awards across several disciplines.

There is no doubt that Inky's personality, fun living attitude and love of a good joke, endured him to his fellow club mates and indeed his fellow competitors as whilst he was competitive, his larrikin attitude enabled him to also get along well with officials, where he was known to use his personality following a draw for places on the start line, that if not happy with his drawn position, would use his charisma to his advantage by cribbing along the beach to gain a better starting position.

During the mid-80's, Ian moved to Victoria. Hoping to maintain his interest in Surf Life Saving, in 1986 he joined and was an active member of the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club. At the 1986 Victorian State Championships with his team mates, he was a member of the victorious Anglesea Open surf Team. He backed up that success by winning gold in the over 30-year surf race. The Anglesea Annual Report quotes that Inky

was considered the recruit of the season, as not only was he undefeated in any race he entered, he was an inspiration to their younger swimmers with his wave catching ability.

If I may quote a fellow team mate of Inky, long time Anglesea member Warren Clarke, who swam with him in the Surf Teams event; "In the Surf Teams event he rose an extra gear encouraging fellow team mates on the line. On the finish line he was always spent having given 100%. Along with his cheeky sense of humour and banter he was highly regarded by the swimming fraternity at Anglesea. As recounted by his family, whilst enjoying a regular training session during this time, he had an encounter with a very large shark, which is perhaps the reason there was an abrupt end to his Surf Life Saving days.

Away from Surf Life Saving, Inky like his brother enjoyed water polo and in 1974 and 1977 was a member of the combined Australian Universities water polo team for their world tour, competing against national teams such as Iran and Egypt. Ian linked up with Melbourne High School Old Boys in the 80's and through the 90's, playing with a water polo club known affectionately as "The Lepers".

Ian gained his Bachelor of Engineering Degree in Mechanical Engineering (Hons) during 1974, whilst at the University of NSW. In 1983, he completed his Masters of Engineering Science. His entire working life was spent, firstly with design and engineering of water meters, before a company move saw a relocation to Melbourne. He continued with this until he formed his own company, Atlas Gas Pty/Ltd, designing and manufacturing gas meters. He remained the company Managing Director supplying the industry as machinery wholesalers until his untimely passing last November.

A man with an active and curious mind, for over a decade Ian fostered a knowledge of the Solar System, developing a keen interest in Cosmology, a branch of astronomy which involves the origin and evolution of the universe, from the big bang to today and into the future.

Inky is survived by his mother Dorothy, his partner Jenny and his children, Amy and Charlie. Brother Peter, a former club member, a four-time Australian Water Polo Olympian, was their Team Captain.

The Collaroy Surf Club extends their condolences to the Montgomery family on the passing of Inky, a true champion who was not afraid to give anything a go, give it his best and enjoy the company of his team mates and friends along the way.

Andrew (Tony) John BROWNE

A member of the "Blue Oysters" Gym group, club member Tony Brown passed away on Friday, 13th April 2022, aged eighty-six years.

Tony joined the club in 2016 and formed a close bond with several of the "Blue Oysters". Always willing to help when and where required, when not at the gym Tony could be found at the Collaroy Rock Pool, doing exercises and callisthenics in the

pool or basking in the sunshine. He was good company, loved to have a chat and to share a joke or two.

Tony was one of a few Collaroy members who had represented Australia in a football code. While he was small in stature, as a five-eighth he was very fast, very skilful and very creative. Between 1956 – 1964 he played 119 Rugby League Games for Newtown, captaining them for six of those years. In 2008, he was named in Newtown's "Team of the Century".

In 1964 he was released by Newtown and joined the second division club side at that time - Penrith. In 1967, Penrith was promoted and became part of the NSWRL. He had the honour of becoming Penrith's first Captain.

On the representative side of Rugby League, Tony played nine games for NSW, and three games for NSW City. Between 1958-60 he played ten tests for Australia and was a member of the 1960 Australia Kangaroos World Cup squad.

As previously mentioned, Tony loved company and a chat. If I may quote fellow club member Doug Patrick, whom he knew well and summed Tony with the concluding paragraphs – "I had many a long talk with Tony in the gym and much was about rugby league – especially the stories of his Kangaroo Tours, like the one where, in a match against France, a spectator threw a chair at the Kangaroo winger as he was sprinting down the side line for the corner"...

Away from football and the gym, Tony worked as a rep and loved it. Nothing better than starting work early, working hard and as he lived in the area at the time, knocking off early and heading to the Bondi Icebergs for an afternoon game of batball.

He was a real character – thoroughly likeable with a fine sense of humour. The Collaroy Surf Lifesaving Club and its membership extends their condolences to his wife Mary and family on the passing of a true gentleman.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The Club recorded an accounting profit of \$48,101 for the year ended 30 April 2022. The Club's Cash Reserves increased over the same period by \$104,526. These are pleasing results.

The salient points are;

- A material increase in income of \$86,944, mainly due to increases in:
 - Operating Income \$37,722
 - Donations \$31,500
 - Grants and Subsidies \$13,833
 - Sponsorship \$6,061
 - Fund Raising \$4,671
- A marginal increase in expenses of \$6,819;
- A material increase in cash and term deposits of \$104,526

The increase in operating income reflects the efforts of our members. Luke and Kate have increased the net Social Fund income by \$19,234 as we emerged from many Covid restrictions. Likewise, the running of our BBQ at Nippers and Carnivals post covid had increased takings of \$12,718. As a Club known for being able to host carnivals professionally and efficiently, we were able to increase our hosting fees by \$7,107.

The Club was also the beneficiary of significant, generous donations during the year and sponsorships (which are covered elsewhere in the Annual Report). I would also like to thank SLSNSW, SLSA, Northern Beaches Council, the NSW Government and the Australian Government for their support via Grants and Subsidies during the year. The Club invested in a new IRB hull and engine during the year using the BSEF Grant from SLSA.

Our fund-raising activities were successful yet again, especially the annual Golf Day. We have now also re-commenced our raffles at The Beach Club Collaroy as Covid restrictions have eased. I would like to thank Jack McCann and his colleagues for auditing the accounts in their typical, efficient manner.

Finally, I would like to thank the Executive, General Committee, Expenditure Review Committee, Premises Committee, Junior Committee, Janine Fahey (Registrations and Carnival Entries), Luke Hochkins and Kate Dampney (Venue Managers) and all members of the Club for their efforts during the year.





Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

a) Basis of Accounting

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared for use by the Executive Committee and members of the Association. The Executive Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity. The Association is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements. The financial statements satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW), the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW), the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth) and the Club's Constitution.

No other applicable Accounting Standards or mandatory professional reporting requirements have been applied.

The statements have been prepared on an accrual basis using historical costs. The prior year comparative figures were prepared on a cash basis using historical costs.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the prior year unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in preparing these financial statements.

b) Assets and Equipment

Assets and Equipment are included at cost. All assets are depreciated at a rate estimated to write off the cost of those assets over their estimated useful life.

c) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Association is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

d) Events after the Balance Sheet Date

The Association signed a lease on 1 November 2021 on significantly below market terms with Northern Beaches Council commencing 1 July 2022. The lease is for the building known as the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club. The term of the lease is 20 years. The lease amount is the Crown Lands minimum rent of \$512 per annum and is subject to annual review. The lease allows the building to be used as a surf life saving club and for other incidental uses.

e) Inventory

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

f) General

* The financial statements consolidate the financial aspects of all components of activity of the Association including Junior activities.

* A schedule of reportable fundraising activities under the Charitable Fundraising Act is shown at Note 3.

* In-kind sponsorship is not recognised as Income in the financial statements.


