6. To arrange youth activities and functions for members.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

On behalf of the Executive and General Committee, I am pleased to present the 111th Annual Report for your consideration and adoption.

This report documents the activities of the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the 2021-2023 Season and includes the Audited Financial Statement and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April 2023.

The last Annual General Meeting was held on 7th August 2022. Members of the Executive elected were Greg Broome, Mark Anderson, Liz Green, Stuart Spencer, Andrew Sole and Craig Thomas.

Patrols

The season returned to new normal, post pandemic restrictions, much to the relief of all. The usual mix of weather and other events resulted in occasional closures due to pollution risk and lightning, and the odd shark sighting and bluebottles across the beaches, put a hold to beachgoers, Nippers' water and training events. Thankfully those events were less frequent this season.

Patrols were again diligent on the beach and congratulations to all patrolling members for maintaining a safe beach this season, again with no major incidents to report. Club members filled volunteer patrols on Christmas Day and on the State and Australian Titles' weekends.

Thanks go to Club Captain, Liz Green and patrol teams for maintaining this tradition at Collaroy.

Competition

Competition numbers from Collaroy were reduced from the prior season. That said, Collaroy competitors enjoyed success at local carnivals, Branch and State Championships (held in the Northern Beaches, at Collaroy and Queenscliff respectively). Collaroy hosted another successful Young Guns boat carnival this year, and the event continues to grow.

The Australian Titles were conducted in Perth this season. A small touring team travelled west and enjoyed some success across the events.

The results of this season's carnivals are presented later in the report. Congratulations to all who competed, whether you gained a medal, made the finals, made a team, or just raced.

Club

Of note this season, the club received a welcome new coat of paint, sponsored by Dulux, supported by Northern Beaches Council and promoted by the Better Homes and Gardens television show. For the trivia question in a few years, the colours are Bayswater and Vanilla Ice ¼.

Branch

Collaroy again hosted the Branch Championships this season over a busy few weekends. Congratulations to all who supported this major event. The work of the many volunteers across the weekends contributed to the success.

Collaroy members also continue to support Branch through BOEA, BOSS panels, and Support Operations on RWC, and the TIPS program.

Community Service

The Club was involved in limited community service events during the year, again due to gathering restrictions in place that curtailed the number of fundraising events on the calendar.

The club also supported and raised funds for Head Above Water 24 Hours Swim event.

Our core community service is conducted September through April, via our core business of patrol teams on the beach. It's always great to see our patrolling members active on the beach, engaging the public, providing tips or information in response to public questions, and the preventative actions to encourage public safety whilst at Collaroy.

All in all, another very busy and fruitful year of continued community support.

Functions

Our annual Golf Day was held in January and the Annual Life and Distinguished Service Members' Luncheon held in April, with both being successful.

The Club continues to host functions for internal club events, members' functions, SNB Branch and other external events for both regular and new hirers. This patronage provides a useful revenue stream to fund club endeavours.

Regular Sunday sippers also saw the bar opened to a varied

attendance, but always with a great view over the beach and water.

Well done to Luke and team for the work they have put in managing the Collaroy SLSC venue and bar.

Nippers

Our junior members have had another great season, particularly dealing with varied conditions on Sundays. They have been successful at Branch carnivals and at the State Age Titles held at Queenscliff beach, in conditions much improved from the prior year.

Christmas nippers is always a great spectacle, and a great way to highlight the family nature of the club. We again congratulate the Nippers on the Christmas initiative of a toy appeal for the children and families who are less fortunate, with a collection of donated gifts presented the Children's Hospital. To Craig and his committee, congratulations on a great year.

AUSTRALIAN HONOURS

NATIONAL MEDAL

The National Medal was established by the Commonwealth of Australia in 1975 as one of the original elements of the distinctive Australian system of honours and awards.

The National Medal is Australia's most awarded civilian medal. It recognises long and diligent service by members of recognised government and voluntary organisations that risk their lives or safety to protect or assist the community.

The following members were recognised for their service under the Australian Honours system.

CLUB AWARDS 2021 - 2022

HONOUR BLAZER

Greg MacMahon was awarded the Honour Blazer, the highest award for recognition in our club, at the 2022 AGM. He becomes the eighth member to receive this award.

Greg MacMahon



To be considered for Honour Blazer, you must be a Life Member - which already has very strict criteria – and after being awarded life membership have continued to render a sustained and conspicuous level of service to the club for at least a further 15 years.

Honour Blazer is a highly regarded level of membership, to the point that in 111 years of club history, only seven members have been awarded this, our highest level of membership. Ralph Chequer 1932, Doug Graham 1954, Bill Goodman 1958, Dick Twilight 1969, Alan Leathley 1971, John Ison 1996, and Neil Montgomery 2012. Greg MacMahon joins this very small and exclusive level of membership as our eighth Honour Blazer recipient.

Greg was awarded Life Membership of this club in 2006 and since this time, Greg has not stopped giving. The details below are only since Greg was awarded life membership in 2006.

He has completed 1287 logged patrol hours (roughly 86 hours a year – some members struggle to do 25), holds the record for the highest number of patrolled hours within the club, and I know for a fact that there are many, many more hours he has not logged.

Greg has mentored and supported countless patrolling members (including the current and immediately former club captains) and continues to do so. Whenever there is a patrol short on numbers or awards, it is normally Greg that fills the gap.

Every Christmas Day since many can remember, Greg has coordinated the Christmas Day patrols, and patrolled himself all day to ensure that the awards are covered, and the beach can remain open. He also arranges food for the day quite often out of his own pocket, rewarding anyone who attends the patrol with a very wholesome Christmas lunch.

Greg is the unofficial club meteorologist and an integral member of the club call out team, quite often being the first person onsite at Collaroy to set up the IRB and is normally the contact person and liaison for Police, Duty Officer and any other Emergency Services that attend.

The hours above do not reflect the fact Greg has taken part in the instruction and then assessment of every surf training week since 2006 (two weeks a year for the last 15 years), as well as instruction and assessing on many part-time courses, IRB Driver and Crewperson, and ARTC. This also does not log the amount of hours Greg spends representing Collaroy at other award assessments as an independent assessor. Greg is a highly recognised and respected assessor within the Branch and due to this is quite often nominated as the lead assessor. Greg also represents the club at Branch Education meetings.

Greg co-ordinates and runs the majority of our skills updates (proficiencies) as

well as many ad-hoc sessions to ensure our club can keep its high standards.

Greg has been a member of the general committee the whole time he has been a life member, aiding in any and every way possible including IRB, radios, First Aid, supplying valuable commentary, advice and counsel to anyone who requests it.

Greg has been either the Emergency Services Officer, or Deputy Emergency Services Officer at every carnival held at Collaroy since he was awarded life membership, another task where the hours are not logged.

In 2020, Greg received the National Medal for patrolling a minimum of fifteen years of more than 30+ hours per season.

Greg has been a continual member and coach of the Collaroy Bears male march past team, winning many Branch, State, National and World medals. He has taken countless amounts of equipment to and from carnivals, not just so march past can compete, there has been IRBs, motors,

R&R reels, rescue tubes as well.

There would not be a single week where Greg has not in some way, shape or form been in the club performing a task, or taking part in its operations, all voluntarily.

Greg has been awarded the John Ison Most Outstanding Member seven times since he was awarded Life Membership - 2007, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2018 and 2019, the Dick Twight Pursuit of Excellence award in 2016, The Bill Goodman Most Outstanding Committee Member in 2011, 2013, 2014 and 2017. He also won the Bill Abbott Most Outstanding Patrol Captain in 2013.

We honestly do not believe Greg could be any more of a clubman, mentor, or worthy recipient of this membership level, living up to the standards of the seven before him.

We congratulate Greg MacMahon on becoming the club's 8th Honour Blazer recipient.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Four club members were awarded Life Membership at the 2022 AGM.

Jacqui de Kort



Jacqui joined Collaroy in 1991 and during the same season qualified for her Bronze Medallion.

For some thirty years, Jacqui has immersed herself in the R & R section of the club, coaching Nippers in both their two person and five person events. She has also competed and coached in all adult / open event combinations of the discipline with a considerable amount of success.

At the club's Annual General Meeting in 2007, Jacqui was awarded "Distinguished Service Membership" for her service to the club over many years.

As the R & R representative, Jacqui was for several years a member of the General Committee.

In 2003, the Ladies March Team was formed, enabling Jacqui to provide the necessary marching experience from the R & R discipline and fulfil the important position of standard bearer, a role she still maintains admirably.

Since receiving her 2007 award, Jacqui has spent countless hours coaching, training, encouraging, motivating and mentoring the younger members. She has instilled in them a self-belief so that they have become excellent club members.

Jacqui enjoys the March Past event,

whereby she and her teammates to date have collected thirty-one medals of varying colour at all major competitions and the World Championships. The highlight would perhaps be their 2017, 2020 and 2022 Australian Gold Medals.

Jacqui has maintained her love of R & R and continues to coach and compete, enjoying remarkable success at all major competitions. This success has seen Jacqui with her teammates win fourteen major R & R club and association awards, as well as twelve medals in major competitions.

Jacqui was awarded the "Col Newman Most Outstanding March Past Competitor" in 2017. In 2012, 17 & 21 she was the coach of the Fred Hopper Memorial Shield Most Outstanding Team In Competition and the Ray Barker Memorial R&R Trophy in 2012.

Greg Broome



Greg gained his Bronze Medallion with Tamarama Surf Club during 1969. Following a period of time with Queensland's Mermaid Beach, he joined Collaroy in 1998.

Whilst spending five years in the Nipper ranks including time on their committee, Greg was very involved in their activities

– water safety on Sunday club days, Branch Championships and N.S.W. State Championships. He regularly provided transport for their gear to carnivals, ran the BBQ and assisted with fundraising.

Greg linked up with the senior side of the club in 2003, where for the next twenty years he was involved in various parts of the club's structure.

Luke joined Collaroy from Dee Why in 1992 to pursue his love of IRB. racing.

He gained his Bronze Medallion the same year. In 2003 he was the club's IRB Captain. In 2004 he was voted the IRB and Patrol Captain of the Year.

He has been voted the club's Most Outstanding Member three times – 2005, 2016 and 2021.

In 2004, Luke became a member of the club's six-person Executive Committee when he took on the role of Club Captain – a role he was to fill with distinction for twelve years, standing down in 2016.

Luke received his Distinguished Service

Membership in 2010 and since receiving this honour he has continued working hard for the club.

Luke became the club licensee in 2006, a role he continues to fill, and Venue Manager in 2018.

He has been a member of the club's after-hours emergency call out team for fifteen years, on stand-by 24/7 where his IRB skills are required and appreciated.

Although now in a "super sub" capacity, Luke regularly assists with patrolling duties to cover shortage. If called upon, he is one

Phil joined Collaroy in 1997, gaining his Bronze Medallion in 1999. He spent four years on the Nipper Committee (2000-2004) before moving onto the Senior Committee

where he took on the responsible position of IRB Captain. In 2002 Phil was awarded the "Doug Graham Most Improved Member".

Such was Phil's commitment to patrolling that over the years he has obtained thirteen major surf lifesaving awards.

On the administration side of the club, Phil served on the club's Executive Committee for ten years, taking on the role of Club Secretary in 2009, relinquishing it following a move north with his wife Anna to Harrington, on the mid-North Coast, in 2019.

In 2008, Phil became a Level 1 Official and has continuously represented Collaroy

at Branch, NSW State and Australian Championships since that time. Last season, he was presented with his ten-year Certificate of appreciation. For just over twenty years, Phil was a regular patrolling member at Collaroy Beach.

For ten years 2009-2019, Phil was responsible for the production of our Annual Report, a production which continually reaps high praise for it's quality of content.

Phil's extensive involvement at Collaroy sees him also involved with First Aid at carnivals and at annual proficiencies, as well as at biannual training weeks for Bronze Medallion applicants.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am always impressed by the calibre of our members at Collaroy SLSC.

This season was an extremely busy one for our club, in all areas, and the membership's contribution to our success this year was outstanding.

Patrols were kept busy with many visitors from all parts of Sydney many who struggle to understand the surf safety message and have poor surf knowledge or swimming ability. A large number of resources are being put into surf education by government, surf lifesaving and community groups which will provide results but over time this will need to be an ongoing process.

Collaroy hosted the Branch Championships in February, the first time since 2016, and our members were called upon to provide work parties, BBQ teams, first aid, IRB crews, water safety, officials catering and importantly bar staffing.

I am proud to say we did not miss a beat over four weekends in providing any of these requirements resulting in one of the best Branch Championships seen on the Northern Beaches for many years. Many compliments by competitors from several clubs as well as huge thank you and compliment by senior officials and the Branch prove that the Collaroy team is the best there is in running a carnival.

We also hosted Collaroy's own carnival in January, The Young Guns boat carnival, again a great success with crews from all over the East Coast participating. The camaraderie, spirited racing and skills of these younger competitors was on show and hopefully they can take surf lifesaving to bigger and better things.

These carnivals provide valuable funds through hosting agreements and sales through amenities provided by the club that go to keeping our rescue equipment and the club in first

class condition.

My concern for our future generations of lifesavers is the pressure being put on volunteerism. This is also evident in other community groups that rely on volunteers.

There are several bureaucratic hurdles put in front of those who want to give their time and a number see volunteering as almost another job instead of enjoying being part of a group helping others. The training area is a good example of this with paperwork taking up a good deal of time that could be used in passing skills onto new lifesavers.

This is an area our movement must watch closely to avoid people turning away from surf lifesaving.

Collaroy SLSC is in a very strong position to keep moving forward. We are strong financially, strong in great patrolling members, strong in dedicated workforces when needed, strong in competition, strong in ideas to keep improving our club and particularly strong in committed committee members with vision.

Our club has had several improvements over the past 10 years, and I anticipate this agenda will continue as we move forward.

This will be my last President's Report and I look forward to supporting the new leadership of our club.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my 10 years as President but could not have served the membership if it was not for the support of my wife Vicki and my family.

To the committees I have worked with thank you for all your support and to the members of the club my role was made not only enjoyable but personable which means so much to me. Thank you for your dedication to Surf life Saving and to our club, Collaroy SLSC.

We had a few new parents join the committee as age managers and in other roles, with everyone pulling together as a team to make the season a success. The BBQ was on fire!! TOURING TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT – AUSSIES 2023

Scarborough Beach March 27- April 2 2023

Again, a privilege to be this season's Touring Team Manager. Planning commenced late in 2022 when numbers started to come together for competitors prepared to head west. Travelling to WA is always a massive effort for logistics, accommodation and airfares. A small working group was put together, including Janine Fahey, Mark Anderson and me.

In the new year, early bird entries were made for 3 Masters competitors, 3 boat crews and a March Past team, all female. Gavin Scott sourced accommodation for the Boaties in Fremantle with other team members split in and around Scarborough and Perth itself. Gav also sourced (and donated) a 12-Seater bus for the daily commute to Scarborough and back. Long time patrolling member (and an ex-boatie), Ian (Wellsey) Wells offered to tow the boat and MP reel across the Nullarbor. Brooke (Perry) Miller's board was taken across via an offer from a fellow SNB surf club.

A touring team meeting was convened on Sunday March 12 with Gavin Scott and Alana de Kort announced as Touring Team Captains. The following Sunday, The Mark Reece was loaded onto the trailer and the MP reel was disassembled by Jacqui and Paul (de Kort) and Paul and Alison (Ducker), loaded onto the ute for the long trip west the following day. Wellsey arrived on Monday the 27th safe and sound, 'the Reecie' weighed in at 197.3 kg at scrutineering (300 grams below the minimum) and the 'Alana' (MP reel) was reassembled ready for action.

Early in the week, our Masters competitors continued their recent success on the sand with Kerry Armstrong (2 gold, 1 Silver) and Miho Kawasaki (3 silver) dominating their age groups, Brooke also had some pleasing results in the water in a far tougher age group. Special mention to Kerry and Miho's training regime and equally important patrolling hours throughout the season, a stand out.

Opens competition commenced on the Thursday (in millpond albeit windy conditions) with the Crusaders progressing easily through their rounds. Friday saw the Giants and Cobras also progress through theirs, with petrol in the tank. However, Saturdays are always tough with elimination races commencing. Following training, the Marchies and their plus ones were in force as supporters for the Red Caps and apart from an early close call with the Giants, all 3 crews travelled back to Freo with the knowledge that they'd progressed through to 'Sunday at Aussies.'

Sun up on Sunday saw Finals Day with the entire team still sporting their distinctive 'pineapple tattoos' from the prior day. March Past competition was tight with a bewildering 120+ beat from the Pipe Band clearly quicker than anything I've witnessed before. After back to back Gold, our team finished 5th taking some solace that they received lower total points than any other team in competition. Their thoughts turned quickly to support and it was a quick coffee and 'let's head down to Boats'.

Sunday's program sees 3 races, a minor semi, a major and the final. All three crews progressed through their first hurdle. Unfortunately, our U23 Crusaders were eliminated in the major semi after being in the leading group at the cans, later it was discovered that their rowlocks were not correctly adjusted, heartbreaking for all. Our U19 Cobras made the final with a record of finishing top 2 in every round and semi for the week. A final is always tough, they collected the Bronze, cheered on by our close-knit supporters, perhaps a little disappointment but as anyone close to competition in the boats knows, a medal at Aussies, in the boats is extraordinary. Never underestimate that.

That segues appropriately to the Giants, our Open Women's crew have never made an Aussie final. Jess Layton has been rowing for 18 years, never made the Open Final. Well they made it this time and drew alley 3 for the Big Dance. Not as quick off the beach as they would've liked, they are trailing at the turn, still trailing through the cans on the way back, still trailing with 20 strokes to go when something happened, 6 months of hard worked kicked in, years of near misses and luck changed, perhaps Alana intervened, who knows but a runner popped up and their back ended, race training paid off - they flew through the field to take Bronze, another 5 meters, it would have been Gold, another 10 and the boat would have been up the beach on the trailer ready to head back to the Roy. In context that's only the 4th Open boat medal in our 110+ year history.

Special day, special celebrations at the touring team dinner back at Freo where 40 of us gathered. As always thanks to all who assisted before and during the Aussies. Our Officials - Anna and Phil Mickan, Janine and John Fahey, Gary Milsted and Dougal Forsythe (Jet skis), Paul Ducker (R&R) and even Kerry Armstrong was called on in the flag pit. Also, great to see John Fahey (30 year) and Paul Ducker's (20 year) recognition by SLSA for Officiating at Aussies.

To the volunteer patrols at home and to every patrol throughout the season, thank you. Coaches and sweeps, family members who never miss a carnival, thank you.

The night was capped off with speeches from our touring team captains, Gav and Alana (delivered by her mum, Jacqui). I doubt we've heard better, laughing, crying and every emotion in between. Saving the best to last, and asking father Paul what section he thought she'd be competing in now, it was an emphatic, 'easy - with the Boats'.

PREMISES COMMITTEE REPORT

This year the Premises Committee membership comprised Gerry Cooney (Secretary), Graham Hart, Doug Patrick, Steve Green, Darryl Gilmartin, Tricia Hamilton and me as Chair. As in the past couple of seasons when most came together, I would like to thank all members for their efforts throughout the season in maintaining and upgrading the club's premises.

Now into its seventies, the building is aging, with ongoing maintenance often requiring replacement rather than repair, to keep abreast of the salt air wreaking havoc on electrical fittings such as fire alarms, door locks, lights, and sensor LEDs. Due to our coastal environment, the lifespan of appliances is greatly reduced and warranties often not applicable.

Although early in my report I would have to say that one of the most pleasing aspects for the Premises Committee this year has been the high level of co-operation and assistance given by the facilities team at the Northern Beaches Council, led by Manager, Donald Gibson and comprising Nigel Hart, Brian Eastbourn, Greg Baker and their maintenance team. Thank you to this team who are regularly called upon for issues under their control which they manage promptly.

Last August, Nigel Hart informed me on behalf of Northern Beaches Council that the surf club building exterior would finally be painted, inviting the club for input into colour selection. Following the ample number of sample colours provided and strategically applied, there remained indecision within the membership as to which would be most suitable, however we finally reached a consensus. With full council approval, the

final selection was that of "the two blues" which we enjoy today. It is now seven months since job completion and the overall feedback has been heartening, with members, council and the public very happy with the finished product.

After eighteen months of negotiating and haggling between Northern Beaches Council, Surf Life Saving New South Wales and the thirteen Surf Life Saving Branches throughout New South Wales, we now have a generic lease for all whose building occupies Crown Land, with an addendum for each individual club pertaining to relevant detail. January 1st, 2023, witnessed the re-signing of our twenty-year building lease with Northern Beaches Council (not July 1st, 2022), set to expire on January 1st, 2043.

As simple as this may sound, it is pleasing to be able to write and highlight that for the first time, the building is "leak free"! For at least twenty years we have had to contend with water issues every time it rained, either through leaking skylights or manage large water volumes unable to leave the guttering and coming up under the roof.

I mentioned in last year's annual report that the continual rains resulted in a delay to installing the solar panels. This is now up and running, connected to the grid and slowly starting to see a reduction in the power bills. Prior to the solar installation, the club's annual power bill was in the vicinity of \$10,000.

Once the Nipper season concluded in March, Craig Thomas replaced the BBQ range hood and ducting in the nipper

shed. Craig sourced a very economical range hood and was ably assisted by Steve Green and Ben Crabbe in the fitting. This project was completed in August, just prior to the commencement of the new season – a job well done, thanks to the three of you.

With the many internal and external functions hosted at the club, it stands to reason that there would be considerable wear and tear on the kitchen appliances and facility. We have replaced our two kitchen blinds and the electrical appliances, following recent extensive and costly repairs, will require replacement in the near future. This applies to the recently replaced dishwasher and soon to be replaced double glass doors refrigerator.

The club gym continues to enjoy healthy patronage. Recently acquired equipment includes a gym station which is yet to be erected. A special thanks to Mike Cassidy, who regularly services the equipment and offers constructive advice on equipment which may require updating, and to the “Blue Oysters” who regularly maintain the cleanliness of the area for all members to use.

One area of continual concern is the aging condition of the cool room. Housing the liquor requirements of the club, this thirty-five-year-old cool room recently required professional cleaning by a company specialising in mould removal. Venue Manager, Luke Hochkins is currently obtaining prices to replace the unit.

During February, we were contacted by council to say that we had the go-ahead to proceed with the proposed gym extension and the proposed construction of the balcony off the lounge area on the northern side of the building, providing the following was met:

“Letter to be sent to local residents and businesses informing of the proposals and seeking their approval and support for balcony and gym extension. If straightforward, work would commence within several months. The club would be expected to assist with costs by applying for funding from several Surf Life Saving building grant programmes.”

Premises Committee have unanimously given their approval to proceed with an Honour Roll Board acknowledging our twelve members who took part in eight conflicts of war since 1945. To the best of our knowledge, no member paid the ultimate sacrifice in any of these more recent conflicts. When completed, this acknowledgement will hang alongside the two Roll of Honour Boards remembering the serving members of World Wars I & II.

A long time in coming, however plans are well underway for our signwriter Jamie Crichton to create the boards highlighting those members who have held Executive Office positions since 1911. When completed, they will hang along the side of the centre span of the southern wall in the lounge.

The unkempt condition of the floor at the club entrance continues to cause concern. There appears to be no acceptable solution to a long-term application or sealant on the concrete floor. Trades dropping off product and gym equipment consistently mark and chip the entrance area, making it difficult for the club and the council to come to an amicable resolution. A shared area with Council, they too are aware and concerned about the situation. They have engaged various companies

and tradespeople to present solutions but no product has been earmarked as suitable to handle the rough wear and tear. The council are soon to organise a steam clean of the floor and stairs to the first floor, hoping to remove heavy staining and rejuvenate the area.

Amy Ryniker and Jon Hynes will vacate the premises on July 1st, having filled the role of caretakers for the past nine years. Their attention to detail and contribution to the wellbeing, security and cleanliness of the building over this period cannot be faulted. As well as tolerating unruly behaviour at all hours in the public conveniences directly below their flat and in the car park day and night, especially over the holiday periods, Amy and Jon have dealt with their duties in an impeccable manner. We thank you for this and for maintaining an excellent relationship with council as representatives of the Premises Committee when removing graffiti, coping with constant issues with the internal fire alarm system, vandalised security gates and fire doors. As we move forward, we thank you both for the relationship we have enjoyed and wish you well in your future endeavours, pleased that you will be maintaining your membership at Collaroy SLSC.

During July, we will be welcoming members Eugene Swanepoel and Jodie Trim as our new caretakers. I am optimistic that the club's membership will make them feel as welcome as Amy and Jon were throughout their tenure.

To all members who willingly brought looming issues to our attention and to those who offered assistance with repair – especially Craig Thomas, Steve Green, Greg MacMahon, Ben Crabbe, Luke Hochkins – thank you for the wide range of expertise covered. This enables management of an aging building to a manner which we all enjoy.

In conclusion, to my fellow committee members, Gerry, Doug, Graham, Tricia, Steve and Darryl, thanks for your continued support, input and willingness to be involved. It has been another productive year.


OBITUARIES

On 24 July last year, Gary lost his battle after a long illness, only days following his seventieth birthday. He was the long-term partner of Distinguished Service Member, Marianne (Maz) Troop and a keen supporter of our Club. Gaz and Maz attended many of our social events as well as our Bronze and SRC Assessments. He will be sadly missed by the Surf Life Saving Community.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The Club recorded an accounting profit of \$67,116 for the year ended 30 April 2023. The Club's Cash Reserves increased over the same period by \$26,500 to \$538,693. These are very satisfying results and reflect a huge effort and commitment from our members over the year.

The salient points are:

- a material increase in Income of \$72,018, mainly due to an increase in Operating Income of \$79,131,
- we received less in Donations and Grants and Subsidies this year but this was largely by offset by the increases in Sponsorship and Fund Raising receipts,
- an increase in expenses of \$53,003 which is consistent with our increase in income, and
- the Club invested in a new surf boat (\$40,020) and solar panels (\$21,760).

Typically, the increase in operating income has been driven by our members. An increase in member subscriptions was largely due to our brilliant Nippers program. Craig Thomas and the JAB committee have done a great job and our reputation among the Nipper community is second to none. The weekly BBQ they run has also been a huge success. Further, Luke Hochkins and our bar / venue team have excelled in the post Covid times by significantly increasing our Social Fund revenue.

This season we were able to trade off our enviable reputation for hosting carnivals by being the venue for the Branch Titles. A broad cross section of members from the Club made this happen from setting up the beach, water safety, first aid,

accommodating Officials and finally providing a venue for everyone to be able to relax at the end of the day. This went on each weekend for a month and this awesome effort directly contributed to our positive bottom line.

Our Ocean Swim returned this year and it too was a success fuelled by our members' efforts. The annual Golf Day was a brilliant event, as always, managed by an enthusiastic group of Club veterans.

Thanks to Barry Muncke for working with all our generous Sponsors, including The Beach Club who also host our monthly raffles. Thanks also to those who have made Donations to the Club during the season.

Aside from the Club Membership, I would also like to thank Sydney Northern Beach Branch, SLSNSW, SLSA, The Surf Life Saving Foundation, Northern Beaches Council, the NSW Government and the Australian Government, and Surf Life Saving Sponsors Ampol, Isuzu and DHL for their support directly and indirectly during the year.

I would like to thank Jack McCann and his colleagues for auditing our accounts so promptly and professionally.

Finally, I would like to thank the Executive, General Committee, Expenditure Review Committee, Premises Committee, JAB Committee, and all members of the Club for their efforts during the year.
