- 5. To affiliate with SLSA or such other association or body from time to time responsible for the administration of Surf Life Saving in Australia and with such similar State and/or District Associations as may be necessary or considered desirable by the Committee.
- 6. To arrange youth activities and functions for members.



SECRETARY'S REPORT

On behalf of the Executive and General Committee, I am pleased to present the 114th Annual Report for your consideration and adoption.

This report documents the activities of the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the 2024-2025 Season and includes the Audited Financial Statement and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th April 2025.

The last Annual General Meeting was held on 4th August 2024. Members of the Executive elected were Mark Anderson, Jesse Bowyer, Liz Green, Stuart Spencer, Andrew Sole. Gregg Armstrong accepted the Nipper Chair role after the AGM.

Membership

We were saddened to hear of the passing of 6 members this season. To the families of the late Bob Langbein OAM, Dorothy Montgomery, Ross Black, Grant Blake, John Brown, Rob Senior, Chris Bradford and Ron Pomering, we extend our sincere sympathy for your loss. Their obituaries are included.

Patrols

Our core community service of lifesaving was conducted from September through to April. Patrols, through our patrolling member's diligence, maintained a safe beach this season. There were a few major incidents/ rescues to which the patrols involved responded quickly and efficiently, including after-hours callouts and a post-season IRB rescue on the afternoon before the club Presentation evening.

Community Service

Club support for community service events continued during the year, including the Beach2Beach Fun Run and Anzac Day Sunset Service. Hire of the club hall was provided at no cost to a small number of groups as recognition for and in support of the broader community service they provide. Regular and returning community service groups across the Northen Beaches area also provided a steady function hire of the hall through the year.

The club also supported a weekly swim tuition/training programme, led by Tricia Hamilton. As an initiative to support improved surf swimming skill, this program has seen a range of club members from active to nippers to adult associates improve their stroke and swim fitness each week.

Functions

Our annual Golf Day was held on 4th January, Ladies Day on 22nd February, and the Annual Life and Distinguished Service Members' Luncheon held on 27th April, with all well attended.

Function patronage and hall hire throughout the year continues to provide a steady revenue stream to fund club endeavours. Regular Sunday sippers saw the bar opened to a varied attendance. The venue team also introduced well-received live entertainment for sippers.

Congratulations to the Venue Team for their support in managing the Collaroy SLSC venue and bar.



Competition

The March Past and Boat sections were both strongly represented with competitors enjoying success at local carnivals, Branch and State Championships (held at Newport, Palm Beach and Queenscliff beaches), and at the Aussies.

Congratulations to The Cannons and Collaroy Black, selected as NSW representatives in the Interstate Boats Championships.

The Australian Titles were conducted at North Kirra on the Gold Coast Queensland, this season. The touring team travelled north with success in Masters and Opens events contested, with gold, silver and bronze medals in beach, march past and boat arenas. This season's carnivals results are presented later in the report. Congratulations to all red cap competitors.

Club Events

The Ocean Swim event was run successfully on the 10th November in good conditions, with competitors from 8 to 80+.

Collaroy hosted a two-day "Weekend @ The Roy" carnival In January, adding R&R, a Surf Belt race and March past events to the annual Collaroy Young Guns carnival. The expanded format has proven a great success, with patronage by boat crews only bettered by State and Australian titles entries. This event continues to go from strength to strength, now showcasing four disciplines across the surf movement.

Branch/State Involvement

Collaroy members also continue to support Sydney Northern Beaches Branch through BOEA and BOSS committees and panels, and Branch Support Operations through RWC operators, Duty Officer roles, and the TIPS program.

A number of club members were acknowledged for their contributions with nominations for Branch Awards of Excellence. Two u19 crews won their Branch boat divisions,

and three members were acknowledged with branch awards.

Nippers

Nippers saw a change in chair this season, with Gregg Armstrong taking over from Craig Thomas. Our junior members increased their competitor numbers, with good success at Branch carnivals and at the State Age Titles held at Queenscliff (relocated to Shelley and Collaroy) beach. Season results are included at the back of this report.

Worthy of mention is the increase in Age Managers per age group, and a welcome sight of recent Collaroy competitors (from Board and Ski, Boats and R&R) now bringing their children through the nipper ranks. To Gregg and his Committee, congratulations again on a great season.

During the 2005-2006 season, Fiona joined Collaroy as a Nipper Associate. She obtained her bronze during the

following season and commenced patrolling duties immediately.

During 2010/11, she completed the Silver Medallion Beach Management course and the following year (2013) she obtained her IRB driver's licence.

There is no doubt that Fiona is one of our best patrolling members, extremely committed with a tremendous attitude, making her an irreplaceable leader of her team.

Always willing to help out a fellow member when asked, without hesitation Fiona will step in to assist with voluntary patrols

A testament to her leadership is the strength of her patrol, one of the strongest and most consistent at Collaroy.

Over the years, Fiona has been the recipient of several deserved awards all pertaining to patrolling and beach

management.

- · 3 years Captain of Patrol of the Year.
- 10 years as Patrol Captain
- 7 years as a member of the emergency call out team.
- 5 years she recorded top 10 patrol hours.

During the 2014/15, Fiona started the Sea Turtles Programme with Jake de Kort and Christian Loone for young disabled.

One of the things that is hard to quantify when collating someone's surf history is the extras they contribute. Fiona has been a regular at all events the club has run for at least the last fifteen years. She contributes to crewing the IRB at any events, covering extra patrols when needed and assisting with training when we are conducting SRC/Bronze and IRB training.

Jessica (Jess) Layton



Jess joined the Collaroy Surf Club as a Nipper competing in the U14's during the 2001 Season and gaining her Surf Rescue Certificate. She gained her Bronze Medallion in 2002 and has continued to patrol the beach for over 20 years. Jess became a Long Service member during the 2016/17 Season.

Jess has won some 48 medals at all major competitions. To date, 14 of those are gold: six Branch Champs, five NSW State Champs and three Gold medals at the Australian Champs, all gained within four of life saving's disciplines – R&R, March Past, Beach Relay and Surf Boats.

After a successful four years in the R&R / Beach arenas, Jess made the move in 2005 and joined the Surf Boat fraternity. She has not looked back.

Over the ensuing 20 years, Jess has become an inspiration and mentor to so many of our young members; she always makes herself available to listen and assist.

Jess's input into our younger members wellbeing has been instrumental in the success achieved to date of our younger crews. In recent times, Jess has been joint Boat Captain, then in 2022 she broke the mould by becoming our first female Boat Captain, a role that for over 100 years (1921) has been the sole domain of male

members at Collaroy.

Jess's bubbly personality and unquestionable leadership skills in the boat section has continued to see a focus on U19 and U23 crews. With an increase of competitiveness in these crews, a higher level of professionalism has emerged into training programmes and preparation, from which each Collaroy crew benefits as is evident in recent results.

In recent times she has been instrumental in developing and executing the concept for Ladies' Day. This annual event has become one of the most talked about events on the Collaroy Summer calendar.

Tim Loone



Tim Joined the Collaroy Surf Club as a Nipper Associate member during the 2004/05 Season. From 2006 to 2014 he was on the Clubs' Nipper Committee, with four years as Vice-Chairman. During these eight years he was an Age Manager (U7's through to U14's). Tim obtained his Bronze Medallion during the 2009/10 Season.

Whilst still an active patrolling member, in 2008 he joined the Men's (The Bears) March Past Team, initially as a competitor winning many titles and medals including elusive gold medals at Branch, State and Australian Championships.

Perhaps a highlight was being crowned

World Champions in the Open March Past event with his team mates during the 2018/19 Season. Tim then turned his coaching and leadership skills to coaching the Bears with a considerable amount of success. In 2022 he Joined the General Committee.

Tim has achieved a lot in his time with the Club. He was an excellent committee person on the Nipper committee and an invaluable help with patrols, both rostered and putting in many extra hours.

Tim's unselfish nature sees him attend and contribute at all events run by the Club, be it work parties at carnivals, water safety or anything that may have been required over the past ten years.

He is a leader by nature, often showing new members the ropes but is also quite content being in the background. Tim always brings a positive, supportive attitude to his time at the beach and can often be found just getting things done without direction or question.

Tim also gives his time to the education team helping with skills maintenance, regularly co-ordinating members and organising sessions.

Stuart joined the club in 2010 to support

his daughter Emma, who had joined the Nippers. He obtained his Bronze Medallion the same season and commenced patrolling duties, his record of which over thirteen years is quite impressive and outstanding:

This season, our dedicated patrol members undertook over 5,200 hours of voluntary patrolling across 140 patrols. Through their vigilance and expertise, they performed 128 preventative actions and conducted numerous rescues, ensuring the safety of countless beach users who came to enjoy our beautiful stretch of coastline.

These statistics represent more than just numbers – they reflect thousands of hours of selfless service, split-second decisions that prevented potential tragedies, and the professional skill of our lifesavers who stand ready to respond when called upon. To every patrol member who donned the red and yellow this season, thank you for upholding the finest traditions of surf lifesaving.

Looking ahead to next season, our strategic focus will be on increasing our patrolling capabilities and continuing the upskilling of our patrol members. We recognise that investing in our people through training and development is essential to maintaining the high standards of beach safety that our community expects and deserves.

Our signature "Weekend at the Roy" event has cemented its place as the premier competition on our calendar, widely regarded as the best-run event of the season and one that will proudly return next year with even greater ambitions.

The numbers speak for themselves – 156 boat crews entered our competition, a participation level only surpassed by elite national events such as the Australian Surf Rowers League Australian Open, NSW State Championships, and the Australian Championships. This achievement places Weekend at the Roy firmly among the country's most significant surf boat competitions.

Our competitive success was equally impressive. Our U19 crews led the charge, claiming victory in both the men's and women's divisions, showcasing the strength of our junior development programs and the bright future of competitive rowing at Collaroy.

The resurrection of our R&R competition proved equally popular, with 26 teams participating in events that included the thrilling Belt Race dash for cash. Our own Jake De Kort represented the club with distinction, finishing third in this prestigious event and demonstrating the calibre of athletes we



continue to develop.

The coveted Norm Chaffer Trophy competition saw fierce rivalry across six competing teams, with Collaroy Ladies finishing an outstanding second place, the Bears claiming third, and the Comebacks securing sixth position. These results reflect the depth of talent and competitive spirit that defines Team Collaroy.

Beyond Weekend at the Roy, our club achieved outstanding results across Masters Beach, March Past, and Boat sections throughout the season, further cementing our reputation as a club that excels across all disciplines of surf lifesaving competition.

In line with our strategic focus this season, we have taken significant strides to enhance the experience and facilities for our valued members.

Following last season's unsuccessful grant application, we are pleased to report that with Sue Hart's invaluable influence and advocacy, we were successful in securing grant funding this season. Once we receive final approvals from council, construction works will commence, bringing us closer to realising our vision for improved club facilities.

Additionally, we have lodged a Development Application for the long-awaited balcony expansion of our function and bar area. This development will provide enhanced amenities for our members and guests while creating additional revenue opportunities for the club's ongoing sustainability.

I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to all those who supported and participated in our Ocean Swim, Golf Day, and Ladies Day events. I'd also like to extend a big thank you to all the parents who helped out when they could. Your support made a big difference, and it's truly appreciated by all of us.



Under 6's – Matt Gittoes, Ralph Gore, Tim Hosking & Neil Leahey



Coming from a track running background, joining the club was initially to utilise his exceptional running talent for extra training in the soft sand and competition in Beach Sprints and Beach Relays, where for a period of time he and his teammates did enjoy a considerable amount of success.

In 1951, the same year he placed second in the NSW State and Metropolitan Championships in the Beach Sprint, Beach Relay and Beach Flags, Bob won the gold medal at the Australian Championships in the Open Beach Relay with Barry Heath, John Tennyson and Neil Montgomery.

In 1953 the relay team won the NSW State Championship.

There would then be a hiatus of some 41 years before Bob would make a competitive come-back and enjoy success running on the beach at the highest level, when he won gold in the over 60's Masters' Beach Sprint and a bronze in the Beach Flags at the 1994 Australian Championships.

From the mid 50's, work and a growing family took Bob away from the club. During the late 60's and early 70's, Bob returned as an honorary parent coach and was happy to assist with the club's young runners who included his son, Rob.

Bob rejoined the club for a third time in 1989 under the inaugural "nipper family membership" as his son Ross had commenced as a nipper. This would coincide with the start of a 25-year (1989-2016) coaching contribution with members of all ages benefitting from Bob's tutelage. During this time, Bob was also the Sydney Northern Beaches Interbranch beach coach for 20 years.

Bob's dedication to coaching Nippers, Opens and Masters runners is indeed impressive. Over those 25 years of coaching and mentoring, Bob was to enjoy a tremendous amount of success watching those whom he coached winning many Gold, Silver or Bronze Medals in Beach Flags, Beach Sprints and Beach Relays, across the full spectrum of beach events at Branch, NSW State, Australian and World Championships.

A highlight for Bob would be coaching the Collaroy Open Beach Relay team of Michael Kember, Ross Langbein, Dean Scarff and Elliot Marynissen which, from 2012-2015, won three Australian Open Beach Relay Championships and a World Championship in 2012.

For over 20 years - from 1998 to 2018 - weekends would inevitably see Bob as a member of the Branch Board of Examiners representing the club, officiating at Carnivals - be it Branch, NSW State, or Australian Championships.

In 2000, Bob and Neil Montgomery, who were watching Neil's granddaughter Kristen running at the NSW Academy of Sport athletics track at Narrabeen, observed the use of electronic finishing gates to decide race results. They both saw this as the future way to go for accurate results at the finish of a Beach Sprint or Beach Relay.

Sponsored by the Beach Club, they were trialled successfully at Collaroy's East Coast Masters competition in 2002 with Bob the chief operator of the electronic finishing gates. The gates were then successfully introduced into major competition at the 2004 Australian Championships. So committed was he to ensure that all race results were accurately decided, Bob was the chief operator of these gates for fifteen years.

Over many years, Bob was also extensively involved in various aspects of our Branch. Listed below are his most notable achievements -

1952 - Inaugural winner of the club "Best Patrol Member Trophy". That same season also saw Bob's patrol win the "Best Patrol Competition".

1952 - Assistant Chief Instructor.

1952/1953 - Branch Delegate.

1998 - 2000 - Club Secretary.

1998 - awarded Distinguished Service Membership – Collaroy SLSC.

2001 - Club "Most Outstanding Member".

2001 - SNB Branch - Distinguished Service Award.

2004 - Life Membership Collaroy SLSC.

2005 SNB Branch - Life Membership Award

2011 - NSW State - Life Membership Award.

2019 - Australian Government OAM for services to the community and Surf Life Saving.

Since 1999, Bob has been an active member of several club committees or club positions, notably Life Membership, Competitor Support, Race Secretary, Golf Day, and Branch Delegate.

Activities away from the Surf Club included his love of golf – be it playing or within administration. Over the years Bob held several positions on the committee of the Bayview Golf Club, including that of Captain and President.

Professional foot racing or "Gifts" as they are known, are handicapped sprints run over 120 metres on grass - very popular during the 50's and 60's. Bob competed in several, including winning the Gunnedah Sprint and very proudly the Grafton Jacaranda Gift in 1956 – at the time the most prestigious foot race in NSW. Still run today over Easter is Victoria's Stawell Gift. Bob competed in that race, however, coming from NSW, found his handicap for an outsider, difficult to overcome.

For over a decade in the late 60's and 70's, Bob was involved in the horse racing scene around Sydney and a member of both the AJC and SJC racing clubs, which enabled him to work on all Sydney racetracks. Being a bagman/penciller working at times for leading Sydney bookmakers Bill and Jack Waterhouse, along with the colourful Terry Page, Bob is credited with "pencilling" in for Terry Page the first \$1 million single bet in Sydney placed by the late Kerry Packer. For a period of time, two of Bob's sons, Rob and Brian, also worked with Bob "on the track".

Bob is survived by his wife Adriana, children Rob, Mark, and Ross, their partners and seven grandchildren - Katie, Ryan, Holly, Morgyn, Josh, Matthew and Jacob.

The Executive Committee and Membership of the Collaroy Surf Life Saving Club extends its condolences to the Langbein family on Bob's passing, acknowledging his forty-five years of contribution to the betterment of the Collaroy Surf Club.

GRANT "BLAKEY" WILLIAM BLAKE



Friday 6th December 2024 will forever be etched in our minds as on that day we were informed of the sudden passing in Perth, WA of Grant "Blakey" Blake, a popular and respected member of the Collaroy boating fraternity. He was fifty-eight years of age.

During 1980, Blakey joined the club as a 14-year-old cadet, obtaining his Qualifying Certificate in 1981, then Bronze Medallion during the 1981/1982 season.

He did enjoy patrolling and the beach management side of our movement. In 1982 he was a member of the club's Most Outstanding Patrol.

After a few years break he rejoined the club, signalling the commencement of a lifelong association with the boat section at Collaroy. In 1989 Blakey's Reserve Boat Crew won:

- Gold in the Open Reserve Boat final at the NSW State Championships.
- · Gold in the NSW State Stillwater Championships.
- · Silver in our local Branch Champs and
- Placed 4th in the final of the Australian Reserve Boat Race Championship.

Away from Surf Life Saving, being the youngest of four siblings in a sporting family, Blakey was extremely competitive. To the best of his ability, he took on any challenge presented to him with the same competitive spirit that he was to maintain throughout his life. Best described as a sports fanatic, he loved it's theatre, whether watching, playing or involved in games statistics, which from an early age in life, was a special interest.

Cricket held a special place as he played a lot both here in

Sydney and on arriving in Perth during the late 90's. He quickly found a strong club at which to play cricket, where his passion for the game could be maintained. He was a member of teams with the Scarborough Sports and Community Club that won W.A. Cricket Premierships – and when he was a new boy in town, cricket initially was an avenue to make friends.

Before heading to W.A., his winter sport was Rugby League, where he played for the Cromer Kingfishers and Narraweena Hawks. He certainly had a soft spot for and enjoyed following the Manly Sea Eagles.

Later in life, he quickly took to lawn bowls with an amazing amount of success and was very proud of the winners' pennants. During the 2020's he rose to the committee position of Vice—President, a position he held for several years.

His employment was principally within the pharmaceutical industry. So highly regarded was he that on his passing the company for whom he worked changed the name of their "National Sales Person of the Year Award" to "The Grant Blake Sales Person of the Year Award," a huge acknowledgement from a large international company.

Blakey was joined by his family and many friends on February 9th this year to celebrate his life. In a final farewell, his family had his ashes scattered into the sea off Collaroy.

Blakey is survived by his former wife of twenty years, Jody, their three boys Kyle, Logan and Mason, his two sisters Julie and Louise, and brother Mark.

Grant had a lovely personality, living life to its fullest in his prime.

John Brown



The Collaroy Surf Club was saddened to learn that on 26th August 2024, aged eighty-eight years, John Brown passed away at his nursing home in Queensland.

Given his immense contribution to surf boat rowing / sweeping over many decades, the entire boating fraternity within our Surf Life Saving movement, not only within Collaroy, felt the loss when news broke of his passing.

Having already won three Australian Championship Gold Medals (two at the 1957 Aussies – Torquay, Victoria, and one in 1958 at Scarborough Beach, Perth) sweeping crews for North Bondi SLSC, John joined Collaroy following a move to the area during 1967.

He learnt the skill of surf boat sweeping under the legendry boat sweep at North Bondi, Keith "Spaz" Hurst. What John had learnt through those years was to be a turning point for the surf boat rowing method at Collaroy. At the time, the surf boat section at the club was just plodding along, trying hard, however with no set direction.

Life Members Rod Macqueen and Paul Booth both said he was an incredible boatman. It would be true to say that the philosophy and culture John introduced to Collaroy almost seventy years ago, and taken up by the likes of Paul, Steve Scott and many other latter year sweeps, is ensuring the boat section of the club continues to be held in good stead. Within the boating fraternity of our movement, Collaroy is a respected boat club and it all started with John.

Rod rowed both as a junior and senior under John and said that on arrival, he sought to immediately change the rowing technique from Collaroy's original style to a style similar to still water rowing, where the blade is in the water for longer - with immediate effect. John was famed for his hard-nosed attitude. He was a tough task master - firm, strong, sought 100% commitment and a high level of fitness from his crews - no excuses and a no-nonsense approach. If you did your best, whether you were right or wrong – he would ask for no more.

His competition results with Collaroy are impressive, with his crews winning several Australian, NSW State, and local Branch Championship medals.

He was a Branch representative in 1977 and NSW State rep in 1977 and 1978.

John was the club Boat Captain for three years from 1976 to

In 1983, along with Alan Lance, John was the first joint recipient of our club's prestigious Distinguished Service Award.

Being in the printing game for over 20 years - until he moved to Queensland in 1994 - he unselfishly he gave his time voluntarily doing all the typesetting for our Annual Reports, for which the club will always be grateful.


He was an all-round sportsman. Away from Surf Life Saving he played first grade rugby league, firstly with Newtown then transferring to North Sydney Bears, where he had a reputation of being a tough, uncompromising second rower who was handy with his fists. Being a bit of a rogue, he did relish and enjoy the odd scrap. From 1958 to 1962, he played over sixty games for his beloved Bears.

Both John's and his wife Pat's ashes are planned to be scattered together off Collaroy Beach sometime during September this year.

John was a champion boatman and Life Saver who was not afraid to give anything a go, give it his best and enjoy the company of his team mates and friends along the way.

John's late wife Pat, as our Club Secretary, was a former Executive Member of the club who passed away in January of 2017. John is survived by sons Michael and Matthew and their partners, three grandchildren - Jessica, Lachlan and Tristan, and one great-grandchild - Misha.

ROBIN (ROB) DAVID SENIOR



Robin Senior, aged eighty-two years, passed away following a period of illness on Friday, September 28th, 2024.

Robin joined Collaroy SLSC in 1956, obtaining his Bronze Medallion during the 1958/59 surf season.

Finding his way in the competition side of our movement, initially Robin became involved with R & R and in 1960 he and his teammates won the Junior 6 Man R & R title at the Metropolitan Championships. Soon after, he was to join and become part of the Collaroy Men's March Past Team, enjoying moderate success until in 1963, he became part of Club history, winning

Collaroy's first Open Men's March Past medal at the Australian Championships.

Robin enjoyed the camaraderie of team events, being a team player and fitness fanatic. With speed to burn, he was soon to concentrate solely on beach events and in 1962 he was the club's Open Beach Sprint Champion and club point score champion in 1972.

He became part of the Open Men's Beach Relay Team with an outstanding rate of success. At local Branch Championships they won the Open Beach Relay Title in 1963 and 1964.

At the NSW State Championships from 1963 to 1968 they attained two thirds, two seconds and the gold medal by winning the Open Beach Relay title in 1964.

At the Australian Championships, this relay team finished second in 1965, first in 1966 and third in 1969.

Soon after, he was to turn his undoubted talent to coaching our next crop of runners coming through the ranks at Collaroy, with many of his runners going on to enjoy a great amount of success on the sand.

He received his SLSA, 25 Years of Voluntary Service award in 1981.

Whilst his trade may have been that of a hard-working brick layer, he always maintained a high degree of fitness and was only too happy to assist anyone to increase their fitness level. Over the course of his life, he was so respected and sought after that he became the fitness trainer doing sprint work training for many local Rugby League and Union clubs and teams, notably the Cromer Kingfishers and Dee Why Lions.

Those to whom I have spoken whilst compiling this obituary, all said Robin really was a terrific person with a tremendous work ethic. Whilst he was still running into his 70's, he would never ask anyone to do something that he would not do himself. He was success driven and always led by example.

He may have been a hard disciplinarian, a hard trainer, and very strong, but when those he trained, be it a team or individual, were enjoying success, he showed a soft side, becoming quite emotional, happy that all their hard work was bringing pleasing results.

He enjoyed the odd game of golf, and in later years took up both snow skiing and surf skiing. With his teammate in a double ski, he won the over forty-year division in the gruelling 111km Hawkesbury Canoe Classic on the Hawkesbury River. With his winter sport, in 1979 he managed to find time to build and establish a ski lodge at Charlotte Pass.

Robin loved Collaroy Surf Club and set up an area of his home with nostalgic Collaroy photos and memorabilia.

Robin's wife Kay passed away suddenly just three months after Robin on January 8th, 2025, of what could best be described as "a broken heart", such was their bond.

Robin and Kay are survived by their two children, David and Rochelle, and two grandchildren, Kaylinh and Sadie.

ROSS BLACK

Collaroy SLSC lost a respected member when Ross Black passed away during October of 2024.

Ross joined our club as a cadet in 1962, obtaining his Bronze Medallion during the 1963/64 season.

For some 15 years he was known as a reliable patrolling member for his consistency and diligent manner in which he went about beach duties and assisting new members.

However, in the off season, his first love was being a member of the Collaroy Surf Club Beach Football (Rugby League) Team. During the decades of the 1960's and 70's, beach football was an extremely popular winter sport.

Ross played as a valued teammate for almost fifteen years – enjoying a considerable amount of success and winning several titles.

On the administrative side of the club, in 1966/67 he was club Assistant Secretary. In the 1971 Annual Report, he was thanked by Touring Team Manager, Mick Chapman for his contribution in making the club's tour to Perth for the Australian Championships a resounding success.

In 1971 he won the club's Most Improved Member Award.

After 17 years of service, his last year with the club was in 1979 where he was an active service member.

Ross Black's contribution to the betterment of our surf club will always be appreciated, as will be the friendship enjoyed by his many friends at Collaroy.

DOROTHY (DOT) MONTGOMERY



1932 - 2025

It was indeed the end of an era when we learnt that one of Collaroy's greatest supporters, Dorothy (Dot) Montgomery, passed away on Saturday 12th April 2025 following a brief period of illness, aged 92 years.

Together with her older sister Evelyn, they were the ultimate beach girls of the 1940's. Being locals, they spent all their spare summer hours on and around Collaroy Beach and the surf club.

A little-known fact was that Dot was our longest surviving NSW State Gold Medal winner. It was just after the war in 1946 that as a 14-year-old she was invited, and jumped at the chance, to become a member of the newly formed and SLSA endorsed Ladies March Past Team, to compete in competitions. A team put together by club Life Member, Frank Hall, comprising principally of wives, girlfriends and daughters of club members. With an average age of 18 – 19 years, the Ladies March Past became very popular with exhibition marches at carnivals as these ladies, in ahead of the times 2-piece swimsuits, doubled the crowd size, such was their popularity.

In early 1947, they were invited to compete in the first and only N.S.W. Championship held as an SLSA fundraiser at the Sydney Sports Ground. Under the guidance of Frank, they did train hard and on the night were victorious, defeating our neighbours North Narrabeen for the gold medal. Unfortunately, women were not to be accepted into the movement for a further 30+ years, (1980) so the ladies' event was disbanded.

Dot's memory of WWII is worth noting as she could recount the three years 1942 to 1945 as a 9-year-old, spending time in air raid shelters and Collaroy Beach fortified with several rows of barbed wire along it. Beach entry was forbidden as was photography (hence the reason why there are so few photos around of this occurrence). There had been a raid by Japanese submarines the previous night (May 31st, 1942) in Sydney Harbour, with an expectation that there was soon to be an invasion of Japanese soldiers coming ashore along Collaroy Beach. They never did; however, a Japanese landing craft was found washed up in front of the Arlington Hall, or the Beach Club as we know it today.

When a young professional runner named Neil Montgomery arrived at Collaroy from Casino to further his running career, like the many relationships formed within our surf club environment over our 114-year history, Dorothy and Neil became a couple and had a great life together.

Dot may not have been an active member of our surf club however, behind the scenes, she was one of our greatest supporters and contributors allowing Neil "his space" to become heavily involved at all levels of our movement both in competition and administration. Neil's commitment to the club was not possible without Dot's unconditional support. She was comfortable being in the background, although for many decades officiated during the summer season representing Collaroy at local carnivals, Branch and NSW State Championships.

She treasured the time spent with her growing family and watching their boys, especially Gary and Chris, as they both went on to excel in beach events at the highest level of club, state and national competition. Being a sports fanatic, she found time to be involved with tennis and netball. In her later

years, following their move to Tea Gardens, she took up bowls and enjoyed great success with her lady friends in local bowling competitions.

Dorothy absolutely loved the Surf Club and the movement. She had a great sense of humour, did not suffer fools easily and if she was momentarily cross with you, had a look that could almost cut you in half.

Dorothy is survived by her four sons - Gary, Wayne, Glen and Chris, their partners, twelve grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

One of her final requests was to have her ashes scattered alongside Neil off Collaroy Beach, a place where she was born and bred.

CHRISTOPHER (CHRIS) HOWARD BRADFORD



When we were informed that Christopher (Chris) Bradford had passed away on Wednesday May 28th, 2025, following a period of illness, aged 76 - Collaroy Surf Club lost one of its finest surf swimmers, a great character of a man with an infectious smile.

During the winter months of 1965, swim coach & sports media personality Ron Casey, approached our then Club Captain Barry Cripps, informing him that he felt one of his students was never going to excel at Australian pool swimming. However, with unwavering dedication and commitment and possessing a "heart as big as a football" for one so young, he saw the potential for him to fare better in the surf, undoubtedly with ability to become a surf champion.

Shortly after, 16-year-old Chris Bradford joined the club and towards the end of 1965 he obtained his Surf Bronze Medallion. With local swimmer Brook Worthington also a recent new member, these two talented youngsters on board attracted to Collaroy a steady stream of excellent swimmers who, with

Dick Twight on hand to teach the necessary surf skills to excel, enabled Collaroy to be at the forefront of all levels of surf competition over a 10-year period – till the late 70's.

At all levels of competition, Chris's surf record is indeed impressive:

* The only Collaroy member to be selected in two Australian Representative competition teams.

In 1967 as a Junior, Chris was selected to tour and compete in New Zealand. In 1969 he was a member of the team that toured and competed in South Africa.

* At Australian Championship level Chris created a slice of history, as in 1967 he won the Australian Junior Surf Race Title. The following year (1968) in his first year as an open competitor, he won the Australian Open Surf Race Title.

With over 100 years of Australian surf race championships being held, Chris became the first of only two individuals to ever complete this feat.

Over the years, at local carnivals and in Metropolitan Championships, Chris continually medalled. In the surf from 1966 to 1969 at our local Branch (4 gold), NSW State (3 gold) and Australian Championships (3 gold) he was also to win 2 Silver and a Bronze medal.

Along with his Australian Representative Honours, he was in the Branch Rep Team from 1966 to 1969 and a member of the NSW State Team 1967 to 1969, both inclusive.

On the final day of the 1966 NSW State Championships held at North Wollongong, Brook and Chris were to stamp themselves as looming club champions in the red cap when on the final day, Collaroy found themselves figuring prominently for the overall point score title, where points were awarded to the first 5 placings of every final. First prize for the top club was a new surf boat, fully equipped and sponsored by a brand of cigarettes - Viscount. Both boys had swum brilliantly in earlier heats and finals of other events and brilliantly in the heats to qualify for the final of the Junior Surf Race, the last event of the championships. At this stage, Collaroy were only half a point in front of North Bondi who had a champion swimmer and both boys had to beat him to secure the point score title. History will say that they listened to the advice of coach Twight and swam brilliantly, finishing 2nd and 4th respectively. More important was their major contribution to the club winning the surf boat. So happy were the team that on receiving the boat the Collaroy song could be heard for miles as they carried their prize to a waiting trailer. Club Captain at the time, Barry Cripps wrote in his 1966 Club Captains report - "Thus ended a wonderful day in Collaroy's history and a day in which Collaroy emerged from the shadows as a major force in Championship Carnival Competition ". A few weeks later at the Australian Championships, Brook won the Junior Surf title and Chris finished 2nd. Chris won gold in the same event a year later.

During the winter months, Chris enjoyed the comradery of his mates playing rugby and socialising with the Gordon Rugby Club 2nd and 3rd teams.

During 1972, Chris headed North to Queensland where he was

to experience a life of adventure before settling on the Gold Coast. He spent time as a jackaroo at Claremont in Central Queensland and spent a brief period of time on the Sunshine Coast. For a time, he also dabbled in the horse industry both as an owner and breeder. On relocating to the Gold Coast, he was to become a permanent and much-loved identity within in the burgeoning Real Estate industry, working for several real estate companies on the Gold Coast before opening his own successful Real Estate company – Chateaux Realty in 1995.

He was a member of Northcliffe Surf Club in Queensland where he enjoyed watching his children partake in the Nippers. Perhaps by introducing his children and grandchildren to the voluntary world of Surf Life Saving was his way of showing that caring for others is an important ingredient towards a successful life.

Until five years ago when Chris had his first operation, he would maintain a degree of fitness by swimming every day. On speaking both to family members and friends whilst compiling this obituary, right up to his passing it became apparent that he was an extremely popular local - polite, jovial and with his caring nature and wicked smile, he was great company to be around.

On a date to be determined, the Bradford family have requested the scattering of his ashes off Collaroy Beach.

Chris is survived by his two daughters - Kristina and Jamie-Lee; three adopted children - Dean, Scott, and Jessica; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren; and his two brothers, both long term members at Collaroy – Michael, a champion swimmer and Australian Gold Medallist, and John, a former Collaroy Club Captain, and Club President during the 1970s.

The Collaroy Surf Club extends its condolences to the Bradford family on the passing of Chris, an honest and generous man, without an enemy in the world - a man with great business acumen who knew how to enjoy himself, lived an eventful life, and enjoyed it to its fullest.

RON POMERING



Following a lengthy illness, Ron Pomering passed away on Monday June 9th, 2025, aged 73 years.

Originally with surf boat rowing, Ron turned his talents to officiating as Boat Referee, ultimately at the highest level. It would be a fair comment to say that within his love of Surf Life Saving his passion was identified in the Surf Boat arena.

He first joined the North Bondi Surf Club in 1967 where he began his surf boat rowing career, quickly establishing himself as a formidable competitor making numerous Branch, State and National Finals.

In 1979 he transferred to Bronte Surf Club where he achieved the pinnacle of success winning an Australian Open title in the Reserve Boat Final. Over the years he continued to feature in many finals.

In 1981 he transferred to Collaroy Surf Club, remaining a member or Honorary member for some 28 years. In 1983 at the Australian Championships, he and his crewmates finished a very creditable and close 4th in the Senior B Boat Final.

In 1985 Ron turned his passion for the sport to officiating and played an integral part in forming and building the current surf boat community. For some 10 years he was the referee at the annual "Battle of the Boats" held at Pacific Palms and many other local carnivals. Ron served as the Senior Starter at Branch, NSW State and Australian Titles for over twenty years where, with his colourful persona, he had a reputation for fairness amongst all boat rowers.

Over the years of his involvement, Ron has been an educator and mentor to many officials and was a member of the Board of Surf Sports for many years.

In 2016 Ron was awarded Sydney Northern Beaches Life Membership for his services to Surf Life Saving.

On becoming an official, he represented Collaroy at Branch, State and Australian carnivals.

Away from the beach Ron enjoyed his football and played Rugby League through the grades with Eastern Suburbs, and for a few years with several clubs in the North of England.

Ron is survived by his children - Melanie, Anthony and Sean, and six grandchildren.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The Club recorded an accounting profit of \$64,252 for the year ended 30 April 2025. The Club's Cash Reserves increased over the same period by \$40,350 to \$601,908. As per recent years, we have added to our cash reserves by maintaining a consistent surplus.

The salient points are:

- * decreases in Sponsorship (\$11K) and Fund Raising (\$10K) have been more than offset by increases in Donations (\$7K), Grants & Subsidies (\$8K) and Interest Income (\$5K). Operating Profit and Depreciation were also net \$6K better than last year. As above, the total surplus for the year was \$64,252.
- * the investment in a new surf boat (\$42K), named after Club member David Hopper, carried on our tradition of buying a new surf boat every two years. The Club's persistent investment in surf boat equipment and training has been reflected in the outstanding results and commitment from the boat section to all elements of the Club in the past season.
- * we also invested in two new IRB motors this season (\$13K). This was largely funded by our annual Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF) Grant of \$10K.
- * we continued our swim program with the Narrabeen Swim Academy this season. This program, available to all Club members, has received solid support and the improvement in the level of swimming has been pleasing to all involved.
- * as above, our cash reserves increased to \$601,908. This in turn has increased our interest receipts.

There was a drop in Club subscriptions during the year which unfortunately appears to be common throughout the Surf Life Saving community. We were able to offset this with our Bar and BBQ trading and by hosting the "Weekend At The Roy", which was a massive success, and other carnivals.

Thanks as always to our Sponsors, Donors and Grantors for their invaluable support of our local community. Your efforts are appreciated by the whole Club. Our members ran successful Fund Raising and Member Events throughout the year including the traditional Golf Day, the Ocean Swim and our Ladies Day. Extra thanks to the Beach Club for supporting our monthly raffles from their premises.

Luke and his team have run another successful season at the bar with a surplus of \$40K and making the Club lounge available for all members to enjoy.

Thanks to all our Patrolling Members for sacrificing their time to keep our beach safe.

Aside from the Club Membership, I would also like to thank SNB, SLSNSW (who provided an \$7K "cost of living" Grant this season which we used to reduce competitor levies), SLSA, The Surf Life Saving Foundation, Northern Beaches Council, the NSW Government and the Australian Government for their support directly and indirectly during the year.

Thanks as always to our auditor Jack McCann and his colleagues for their professional efforts.

Finally, I would like to thank the Executive, General Committee, Expenditure Review Committee, Premises Committee, JAB Committee, and all members of the Club for their efforts during the year.





Notes of the Financial Statements for the 12 months ended 30 April 2025

Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

a) Basis of Accounting


