- Answer the questions related to any of the above content in BM Theory Assessment

A Surf Rescue Certificate member will need to:

- Watch a video update
- Complete two Lifesaving CPR online learning branching scenarios
- Answer the questions related to any of the above content in SRC Theory Assessment


To access the online go to the members portal and then go to eLearning. Below is a brief explanation on how to get there.



This is the menu you should see when you are transferred to eLearning. This season the PSAR 35 Bronze/SRC manual is not in the publications app it is available on the portal.


You will find it under Training Resources

To access the Skills Update go to Training Library you will then see the below Shot




Click on 2025 Skills Maintenance using the View Courses button

FROM THE HISTORY BOOKS.....

Many of you would have seen the below board in the Goodman Lounge at the Club. It lists surfboats donated by McWilliams Wines, an association that started in 1946 with a rescue.



On the afternoon of Sunday 19 May 1946, the Collaroy Rugby League Football Team were playing against the Dee Why Diggers Team at Griffith Park. The conditions were atrocious with gale force southerlies and driving rain and on the water, an enormous swell was buffeting the coastline.

At 10.30am, six men left Rose Bay in an 18-foot half cabin cruiser for a fishing trip bound for Broken Bay. Around midday and two miles off Curl Curl, the engine stopped and the launch was blown northward. Manly police were alerted but neither the pilot vessel nor the police launch were able to leave the harbour due to the conditions. One of the policemen tracking the stricken launch was Alan Fitzgerald, a member of North Steyne Surf Club who considered that the only boat capable of reaching the launch was a surfboat and the best beach to attempt such a rescue was the sheltered corner at Collaroy.

Meanwhile, Club member, Ian Proctor had spotted the stricken vessel off Long Reef and headed for the Surf Club with his father, Chic Proctor, where the 'Miss Collaroy' was carried onto the beach in preparation for the rescue. The Club had won the 1946 Australian Surfboat Championships so we had a crew capable of such a rescue.

Around 3pm, a police vehicle drove onto Griffith Park and Fitzgerald informed the teams of the situation with the stricken vessel, now about 800 metres off Long Reef. The match was abandoned and the players made their way to Collaroy.

The crew selected for the rescue consisted of Dick and Stan Twight (members of the 1946 Surfboat Champion crew), South Narrabeen club members, Ron Carey and Arthur Le Clerc (the latter a 1946 Australian R&R Gold medallist), Bill Abbott (for his rowing skill and swimming ability) and Chic Proctor (for his invaluable knowledge of the seas off Collaroy).

The surfboat was launched and after what seemed like an eternity cleared the breakers but by then the launch had passed them and was drifting helplessly towards the bombora off Narrabeen. The 'Miss Collaroy' reached the vessel quickly but there was no response from the crew. Bill Abbott swam to the boat, dragging a line and found the six men lying in the cabin suffering extreme sea sickness and hypothermia. They were unable to be transferred to the surfboat so the only hope was to tow the stricken vessel. Abbott tied the rope to the vessel's bow and swum back to the surfboat.

Slowly the surfboat began towing the launch and both cleared the breakers and began to head southwards towards Collaroy using the pine trees as a guide to their progress. The next dilemma was how to get the men to shore. Proctor thought that the better option would be to attempt it at Fisherman's Beach, which was more sheltered than Collaroy and using the deep channel which ran close to the shore.

News of the rescue spread and a number of spectators gathered, amongst them Keith McWilliam, the Managing Director of McWilliam's Wines, who had been enjoying a drink in Long Reef Golf Club following his game.

The journey to the Basin was slow and it was almost dark by the time the two vessels negotiated the shore break and reached the deep water of the channel. At this point the rope snapped and the cruiser was once more at the mercy of the waves. Upon reaching the shallows, the crew of the 'Miss Collaroy' abandoned her and swam to the launch and were able to guide it to the beach. The six unconscious fishermen were transported by ambulance to Manly Hospital.




Diagram showing the rescue

Chic Proctor, Bill Abbott, Arthur Le Clerc, Ron Carey and Dick and Stan Twight received Certificates of Merit from the Royal Shipwreck, Relief and Humane Society.





Following the rescue, a committee of local residents was formed to raise funds for the Club with the ultimate aim to purchase a new surfboat to replace the 'Miss Collaroy'. The committee approached Keith McWilliam for a donation but he decided that he would buy a new surfboat outright for the club. And so began the Club's association with McWilliam's Wines.

McWilliam's Wines sponsored Collaroy Surf Club from 1946 to 1996 and over the years have donated 23 surfboats. Keith McWilliam was patron of the Club from 1955 until his death in 1977; his son Don McWilliam took over from 1977 to 1996. Their iconic "Friar Tuck" also graced our Surfboats for many years. The 50-year relationship was re-established by Keith's grandson, Jeff McWilliam in 2016 with the donation of another surfboat.
