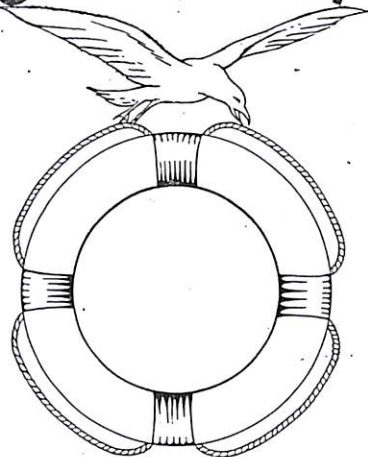


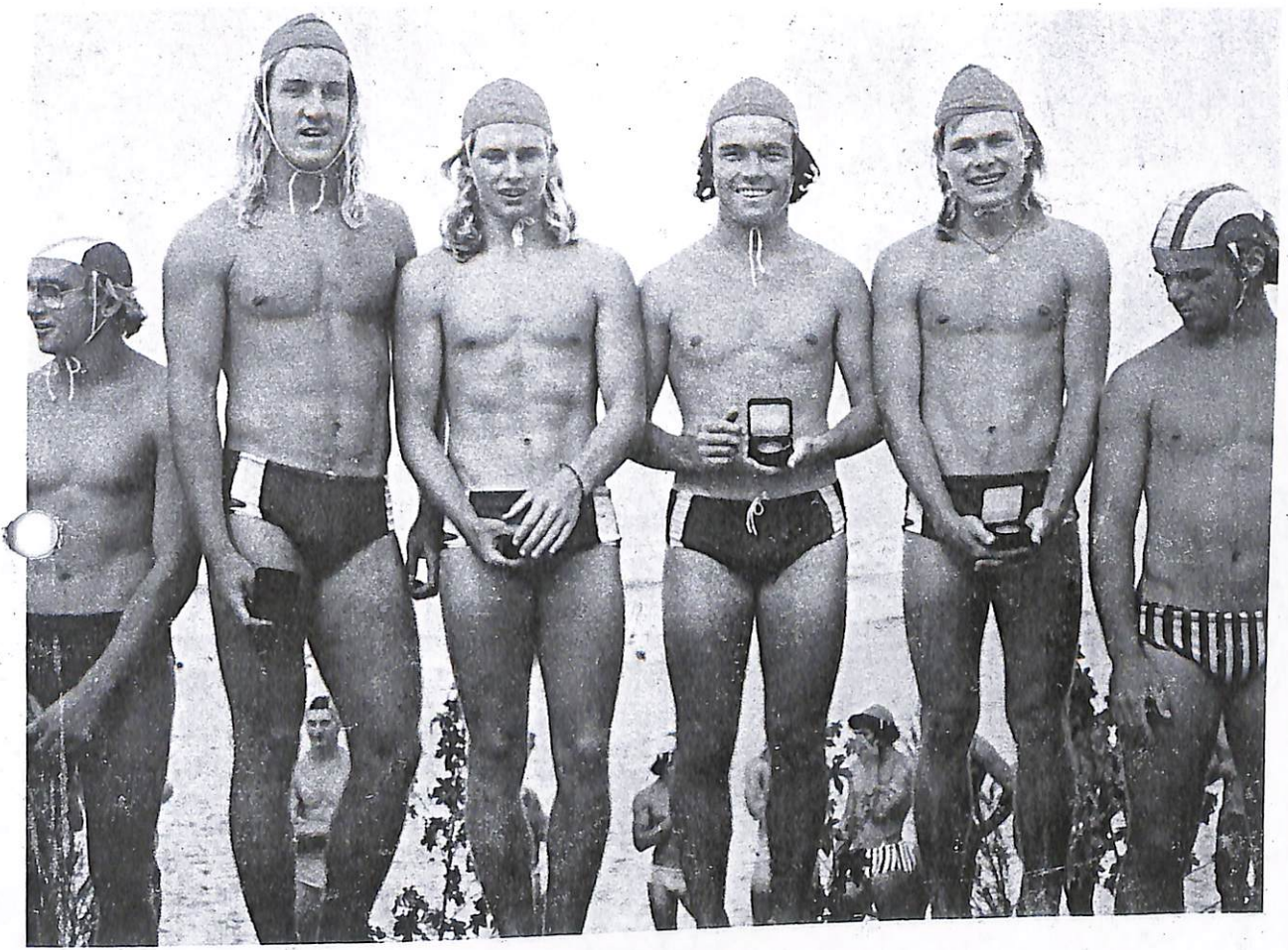

## SIXTY THIRD ANNUAL REPORT. Season 1974-75

Gentlemen

It is with pleasure that your General Committee presents to you the 63rd Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Collaroy S.L.S.C. for your consideration and adoption.

The "raison d'etre" of our organisation — the safe patrolling of Collaroy Beach was carried out so efficiently that we are able to report that very few rescues were necessary during the season.

The results of the Manly-Warringah Branch Patrol Efficiency Competition saw Collaroy improve their position from the previous three (3) seasons. All active members associated with this improvement are to be congratulated.

With the advent of the use of oxygen for assistance during resuscitation it is paramount that all members who may at any time become involved in resuscitation be conversant with this equipment and therefore to improve their own efficiency and that of their patrol. Each member should endeavour to obtain the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate for the coming season.

Our membership figures show a small increase in active members — the first increase in three years. Whilst this increase was minimal, but nevertheless heartening, our greatest gain was in the number of young and new members who joined and we give them a warm welcome to our Club. Already some of these new members have displayed great club spirit by competing in both inter-club intra-club events and also by helping in the general administration of our Club.

A major early season success was the winning by our Club of the Manly-Warringah Branch Gear Inspection Competition for the first time. John Levett and his assistants are to be congratulated on this win which resulted not only in our gear being in first class working order but the winning of a valued rescue ski.

The general improvement in all aspects of our Club extended even to our trouble spot — finance. Full details of our financial situation are covered elsewhere in this report. The major projects in our drive to keep in the 'black' during the past season were the T and T Raffle, Art Union and our open carnival which was sponsored by Nock and Kirby Ltd.

The T and T Raffle continues to provide a steady flow of money into the Club and the efforts of the small group of organising members are appreciated. Under the sponsorship of Nock and Kirby Ltd and principally through the efforts of Bill Windeatt and John Bradford we held our first open carnival for some seasons.

To Nock and Kirby Ltd, and Bill Windeatt, we are indeed thankful for their welcome support.

Due to generous grants from the Collaroy Services Beach Club Ltd and Warringah Shire Council, we shall, by the commencement of the 1975-76 season, have purchased sufficient lifesaving gear to cover ourselves from any major expense for some seasons.

We are most grateful to Warringah Shire Council for allowing us to purchase lifesaving gear in lieu of a surf boat, which is normally granted to three clubs each year on a rotation basis.

Collaroy was again fortunate when Speedo (Aust) Ltd decided they would provide \$3,000 in costumes and cash for winners of the March Past at the major championship carnivals. Besides winning a set of march past costumes and some forty pairs of swimming costumes our team was successful in winning approximately \$2,000 in cash and the bulk of this will also be used for the purchase of additional gear.

Inter-Club competition continues to play an important part in maintaining our strong club spirit and attracting new members, and the past season was no exception.

With an average of some forty members competing every week, with reasonable success, Collaroy continues to rank among the top competitive clubs.

We were again fortunate to have conscientious coaches in charge of our competitors and Wal Edmonds (March Past), Rob Senior and Neil Montgomery (Runners), Dick Twight (R&R and Swimmers), and Rod McQueen (Junior Boat) are to be complimented on their efforts during the season. Following the illustrious Grahame Carlisle and Dick Twight, Wal Edmonds became our March Past coach, only the third in thirteen years. In his first season the team won the "Grand Slam" — the Branch, Metropolitan, State and Australian Championships.

The members of this team trained hard and so maintained the remarkable record our March Team teams have had since winning our first title in 1963.

For the benefit of the statistician, Collaroy's March Past Team have, since 1963, competed in 216 carnivals, winning 162, second on 39 occasions, third 7 times and have been unplaced at only 8 carnivals in 13 seasons. Their victories have netted 41 championships, including 7 Australian, 7 N.S.W., 9 Metropolitan & 12 consecutive Branch Titles.

Junior competitors from our Club were always prominently placed at carnivals and it was a good sign for the future to see the 'reds' appearing in junior R & R, surf, belt, boat, ski, board, sprints, flags and quite often two beach relay teams.

Of course the highlight for our juniors was the brilliant victory of David Booth, Allan Clarke, John Dunne and Chris Montgomery in the Australian Junior Beach Relay Championship at Dee Why. Indicative of our junior strength was the fact that in this final of the Australian Championship we had two (2) teams and it was a marvellous performance by our 'B' Team of Ian Wells, Peter Goodman, Mitch Chapman and Mark Van Asten to battle their way through early rounds and into the last six teams in Australia. Coaches Bob Senior and Neil Montgomery certainly 'peaked' their runners at the right time — congratulations.

Chris Montgomery further enhanced his reputation when he won the N.S.W. Junior Beach Sprint Championship in fine style. He also ran splendidly to reach the final of the Australian Titles.

Another junior to perform very well was Ian Wells who was fourth in both the Australian and N.S.W. Junior Beach Flags Championships, and as Ian is still a junior next season we can be confident of a title coming our way.

For the first time since 1960 Collaroy won an R & R Championship when our Junior T & R carried off the Manly-Warringah Junior R & R Title. This team under the astute coaching of Dick Twight showed just what keenness, dedication and good coaching can produce by coming from virtual 'write offs' early in the season to win the Branch Title and then reach the final of the N.S.W. Junior R & R Championship where they were considered very unlucky to miss a place.

The team consisted of Peter Goodman, Peter (Mitch) Montgomery, Chris Montgomery, Martin Payne, Gordon Williams, John Wells and Mark Patterson, who received the "Ray Barker R & R Trophy" from the coach for his keenness, performance, improvement and general impact on the team. Because of the high standard of all team members Dick Twight considers the selection of the winner of the trophy this year to be one of the hardest he has had to make.

Collaroy's Junior Boat Crew, whilst not reaching the championship class of our runners and R & R teams, displayed a willingness to participate and represented the Club well at all times. Rod McQueen had his crew of Greg and Noel Biddolph, David Booth and "Mitch" Montgomery firing well until the major championships where a couple of his crew were required to compete in other events.

Grahame Windeatt, although heavily committed to his stillwater swimming, made his presence felt whenever he donned the red cap and his great win, in huge seas, in the N.S.W. Open Surf Championship at Swansea proved once and for all he was not just a flat sea surfer.

In between the World Titles in New Zealand in February and the Coca-Cola Series in London at Easter, Grahame was selected in our Branch Team and won the open surf, open belt and was first home in the teams race — a particularly good effort.

Two of our 'old' gang, Mark Anderson and Ian Montgomery, added yet another gold medal to their tally when they teamed with Grahame Windeatt and new member Lee Morgan to convincingly win the N.S.W. Open Surf Teams Championship.

But for the absence of Grahame Windeatt in London at Easter it is possible our surf team could have won the Australian Title at Dee Why. Nevertheless, with 'Buddy' Portier as the replacement, our team finished a very creditable fourth.

Overall, our competitors fared favourably at the major championship carnivals with two (2) Australian Titles (March Past and Junior Beach Relay), four (4) N.S.W. Titles (Open Surf Teams, Open Surf — G. Windeatt, Junior Beach Sprint — C. Montgomery and the March Past), three (3) Metropolitan Titles (Junior Beach Flags — I. Wells, Junior Beach Relay, March Past), and three (3) Branch Titles (Junior R & R, Junior Beach Relay, March Past).

With only two (2) members from Collaroy selected in the Manly-Warringah Branch Team, we had our smallest representation for some years but both members — Ian Montgomery and Grahame Windeatt — upheld the Collaroy reputation by competing and behaving in an exemplary manner.

Following the donation of one of our boats to the Cairns (Q) S.L.S.C. our Club received an invitation for a member from Collaroy to visit Cairns for the opening of their new Clubhouse and to compete at the annual carnival.

The General Committee elected John Bradford, Club Captain — to make the trip and John came back with glowing reports of the hospitality extended to him throughout his stay.

After extensive early season negotiations we were given the honour of being the first surf club to receive a contingent of Army personnel for full time training in lifesaving techniques. The group was housed in our clubhouse for a full week and was given a detailed training programme which resulted in the obtaining of their lifesaving awards — Instructors, Bronze etc.

The President of the S.L.S.A. of A., Sir Adrian Curlew, presented the awards to the successful candidates on our beach after the completion of their examinations.

Congratulations are extended to Peter Montgomery and Grahame Windeatt on their selection to represent Australia at the World Swimming Championships in Colombia.

The success of the Collaroy S.L.S.C. during 1974-75 indicates a growing strength in our Club, and in the opinion of the outgoing General Committee the 1975-76 term could be an even more propitious season.

In all aspects, we are prepared for the next season, and it is with eagerness that we await 1st October, 1975.

## CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Once again I would like to commence my report by saying how much I have enjoyed being Captain. It is a great honour and privilege.

It is not my intention this year to thank each member of the Committee individually for his loyalty and support. Suffice it to say that each did his very best for the club and one cannot ask for more than that. The one person whom I would like to mention is Neil McGaw who as Vice Captain was a capable deputy with loads of potential. We started the season well by winning the Branch Gear Inspection. This was entirely due to our Gear Steward, John Levett, who recruited a few young helpers notably Ian McGaw. I cannot remember the last time we won it but I hope we can do it again next season.

Throughout the season the Club was well represented at carnivals and once again our presence was felt in both water and beach events. State titles were won by the March Past, Grahame Windeatt (Open Surf), Chris Montgomery (Junior Beach Sprint) and open surf teams. Australian titles went once more to our illustrious March Past and to the Junior Beach Relay team consisting of Chris Montgomery, John Dunne, Allen Clark and David Booth. The depth we have in runners was illustrated by the fact that we also had a Junior 'B' team in the Australian final. Chris Montgomery was once again a finalist in the Junior Beach Sprint and was unlucky to lose.

Throughout the season we saw some fine displays by the Junior R & R coached by Dick Twight. This team won the branch title and came fourth at the State, just missing out on qualifying for the event at Dee Why.

The Open Surf team consisting of Mark Anderson, "Inky" Montgomery, Lee Morgan and "Buddy" Portier came fourth at Dee Why no doubt beaten only by the dead flat conditions which prevailed on the Sunday morning. Grahame Windeatt was missed for this event (being overseas) and I fell sure he could also have taken out the big double again if he had been there. A few other competitors performed creditably during the season. Ian Wells made both State and Australian finals in the Junior Beach Flags. Mike Malady was placed in most of his starts in Cadet board and ski events.

In my opinion it doesn't really matter who wins ultimately but rather that we have members willing to don the old red cap and "have a go". There are many such triers in our club and they deserve all praise and encouragement. Certainly in our Sunday morning Club contests anyone can win the way our handicappers operate (no disrespect intended to Laurie McGaw and Harry Biddolph who did a fine job).

In regard to patrols, although we improved our position in the Branch Patrol Efficiency competition there is still a long way to go. Some patrols achieved excellent reports but we were let down on just a few occasions. I would really like to see us take out first place in that contest.

Once again we had a number of new members join resulting in an increase in active membership. I hope all new members enjoyed their first season in Collaroy and trust they will be back next season with a few friends as new members for 75/76.

I would like to say a special thank you once again to our young Ladies' Committee for their assistance on a number of occasions during the season and to our supporters generally for the encouragement they give.

During the season we organised a highly successful carnival with the sponsorship of Nock & Kirby Ltd. Many members and supporters contributed to this. It was great to see old members coming forward to assist on that occasion also.

The Club participated in the annual Red Cross Calling appeal this year and members (mainly Juniors and Cadets) collected \$246 for that cause. I am sure our reputation in the community was considerably enhanced by our apparent willingness to support a charity outside of our own. It would be good if we were to do the same again next year.

In conclusion let me briefly look to the future. Next season promises to be a very exciting one. The Club has a large amount of money to spend on gear and this will benefit all members. We have trips away to Kempsey-Crescent Head for the State titles and to Hobart for the Australians. We also plan to hold another carnival. All this adds up to a lot of work for the new committee and the members generally. Fund raising for the tours will be a very important activity. All this in addition to our continuing responsibility for the safety of the public using our beach each weekend. Members who are not prepared to work next season should think very seriously about rejoining.

Finally, let me say how much I have valued the involvement of parents, particularly of younger members, in the club. It all makes for a family atmosphere and I would certainly encourage parents to come forward and offer their services. There is always something to be done.

Both these squads competed very capably in the Mitchell O'Neill R & R Memorial held on the Sunday morning, after which they were presented with their awards by Sir Adrian Curlewis at a successful social function in the clubhouse. Collaroy was fortunate in having three of the team join our club...L. Lister, T. South and A. (Gomer) Pyle.

Ten Collaroy members gained the Advanced Resuscitation Certificate. My thanks go to Mick Chapman and Neil Monty for their work in this regard.

It is pleasing to note that Collaroy this year had four members gain the difficult Instructors Award. Brian Booth, John Bradford, Wal Edmonds and Lloyd Lister were the recipients. These instructors were involved in the training of eighteen Bronze Medallion and qualifying awards. Congratulations to all these members.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the Manly-Warringah Board of Examiners for the work involved in examining our candidates and in particular Ted Whittaker, our District Supervisor.

## PREMISES REPORT

Increased regular letting during the past year lifted income, but a carry-over of debts from the previous year, plus the need to subsidize the General Account again this year left a balance of only \$70 at the end of the year. The deteriorating state of the equipment in the hall is evidence of the result of the diversion of Premises Committee funds to other uses. New tables and chairs, renovation of the kitchen and a new cleaner are only some of the things needed when funds are available.

The apparent profit of \$226 on the 1974 Australian Championships in only the final settling up. The previous Annual Report showed \$344 excess expenditure, so that the final result on the 1974 Australian Championships was a loss of \$108, made up from Premises Committee funds.

Ways and Means Committee funds increased by over \$650 during the year and now stand at \$3,426.

Unfortunately the Odeon Milk Bar closed down just before Easter and the Club lost a strong supporter. We express our appreciation of the help and assistance received from this source over many years.
