## **SWIMMING TRAINING**

Swimming at Sydney Academy of Sport and Recreation continues through the off-season. This is a great way to maintain fitness over the off-season and/or develop efficient swimming skills.

I am blown away by the amazing improvement I see every week. It is being reported that some of our nipper members are moving up levels at other swim venues, which is exciting. Well done, team!

I would like to thank Anne Jenkins of Terrey Hill Swim School for allowing CSLSC to participate in this vital program. Thank you to the 2 coaches, who are always there to assist me in my endeavour to improve the swimming section of CSLSC.

**Expectations.** Look at, listen to and respect your teacher. If you're asked to do a drill, there is a reason, so do it to the best of your ability.

**Remember, Practice makes permanent!**

**The Roles.**

- **Our role** is to help you become a better and more efficient swimmer; to swim like a fish, by making your body as tall as you can to glide through the water.
- **Your role** is to be able to finish the session, knowing that you have learned at least 1 new thing or could perform a skill better than the last time. I am constantly evaluating my skills to this day and I have been swimming since I was 2.

**How can we swim like fish?**

**Think!**

1. About every entry, every recovery, every pull. Watch for no bubbles around your hand (That's a perfect entry)
2. Hide your head. We are icebergs in the water. 10% above and 90% below.
3. Imagine swimming downhill. Could a seagull hitch a ride on your butt?
4. Are your hips driving the stroke? Is your core engaged? Try to obtain an 180-degree roll and rotation of the body. Do I have high elbows and shoulders in every rotation? Yes, folks, we swim mostly on our side to develop the most efficient technique. We float on our sides and propel forwards or backwards.
5. Entry of the arms, finger-tip in, by piercing the water (make it as silent as possible) and reach forwards for the wall as though every stroke is the last one before you touch the wall.

**More advanced swimmers.** How many strokes are completed for each lap? Is the stroke rate constant? How can I reduce the stroke rate to pull 1 or 2 strokes less for each lap? I still am constantly counting my strokes per lap.

**How are swimming and golf similar? A lower score is better.** In swimming, the lower scores consist of heart rate, velocity and stroke rate per lap.

Can I breathe anaerobically during sets? e.g. breathe every 3, 5 or 7 strokes, to build lung and heart capacity.

Could I maintain any of these breathing patterns for 100m, 200m or 400m?

Am I taking 2 or 3 strokes after a tumble before I breathe?

How do I track efficiency, speed and aerobic fitness?

Keep coming, everyone. The atmosphere is great. The pool is warm. There isn't a wind or chill factor.

Time: 6.30 to 7.30 pm, every Thursday.

Cost: Free to financial members.

Requirements: Must be able to swim 25 m.

Equipment: Kickboard and flippers (Silicon flippers are the best), Pool buoy, and swim snorkel if you'd like.

## **FROM THE HISTORY BOOKS.....**

With the results from our Presentation Night in this edition, it is probably opportune to lightly touch on the members behind the award names.

### **Dick Twight OAM Pursuit of Excellence**

R.N.(Dick)Twight gained his Bronze in 1942 and competed in surfboats, R&R and March Past. He was a member of the crew that won Collaroy's first Australian boat title in 1946 and was part of the epic rescue that saved six fishermen from the Narrabeen bombora. He held the positions of Vice Captain, Club Captain, Boat Captain, Deputy President, President and Club Patron. He was awarded Life Membership of Collaroy in 1954 and Branch in 2004. He received the Club's highest honour, the Club Honour Blazer in 1960, received an OAM for service to surf life saving in 1990 and the Australian Sports Medal in the 2000/1 Season. Dick passed away in 2013 at the age of 87.

### **John Ison Most Outstanding Member**

John obtained his Bronze in 1958/59 and competed in Club beach football, R&R and March Past, being part of the March Past Team that won our first Australian gold medal in 1963. During a March Past career, spanning in excess of forty years, John received twelve Australian gold medals. He also became heavily involved in the administration side of the Club and held the positions of Deputy President, Secretary, Club Captain and President. John also served on the Ways and Means, Life Membership and the 1992 Australian Titles Organising Committees and was a key member responsible for our history book "Vigilant and Victorious." John was awarded Life Membership in 1976 and was the fifth recipient of the Honour Blazer in 1996. John passed away in 2005.

### **Paul Booth Boat Crew of the Year**

Paul Booth obtained his bronze in the 1966/67 Season, initially competing in beach events before making the move to surfboats in the early 1970s. He has won Australian medals in both disciplines including several Australian gold surfboat medals. Paul has been a State and Branch Representative both as a rower and a sweep. He has held the position of Boat Captain and been awarded the Club's Most Outstanding Member. Paul was awarded Life Membership in 1990.

### **Frank Hall Memorial Boatman of the Year**

Frank obtained his Bronze in the 1938/39 Season and became a surfboat rower. He was also a member of the crew that won Collaroy's first Australian boat title in 1946. Within the Club, he held the roles of Boat Captain, Club Captain, Secretary and President. He was actively involved in recruiting new members and in 1947, he coached the successful Ladies March Past Team. He was awarded Life Membership in 1949. Frank passed away in 1992 aged 77.

### **Doug Graham Most Improved Member**

Doug was a foundation member in 1911 and involved in the construction of the first clubhouse in front of the Twight Tea Rooms but did not become involved in the running of the Club until the 1930s. He held the roles of Vice President, President and Club Patron. In 1944, Doug was made a Life Member and in 1954, was the second Honour Blazer recipient.

### **Stan Twight Rowers' Encouragement Award**

Stan gained his Bronze in 1940 and was an outstanding board, R&R, March Past and Boat competitor. He held the positions of Vice Captain and Club Captain and was also a member of the crew that won Collaroy's first Australian boat title in 1946 and was part of the epic rescue that saved six fishermen from the Narrabeen bombora. He was awarded Distinguished Service in 1996. Stan passed away in 1998.

### **Reid Barton Memorial Most Outstanding Patrol Member**

Reid obtained his Bronze in 1967/68 and became a member of the March Past Team. He held the positions of Social Secretary, Club Captain and was a foundation member of the Ways and Means Committee (which was formed to try to increase crucial club revenue). Reid passed away in 2006.

### **Alan Leathley Rookie of the Year**

Alan gained his bronze in 1945 and held the position of Chief Instructor for many years. He was the Most Outstanding Member in 1948, 49 and 1953 and was awarded Life Membership in 1962 and was one of only 8 Honour Blazer recipients.

### **Bill Abbott Most Outstanding Patrol Captain**

Bill joined the Club as a Nipper in 1932 but was not able to obtain his Bronze until 1939. He obtained his first Australian gold medal in that same year as a junior belt swimmer but also competed in R&R, March Past and Surfboats. He was also part of the epic rescue when he swam the tow line to that stricken vessel in 1946 and for his part was awarded the Certificate of Merit by the Royal Shipwreck, Relief and Humane Society. Bill held the positions of Boat Captain, Club Captain, Vice Captain and Chief Instructor. He was awarded Life Membership in 1958. Bill passed away in 2012 aged 90.

### **Bill Goodman OAM Most Outstanding Committee Member**

Bill obtained his Bronze in 1943 and went on to be Club Treasurer for an incredible 60 years. He was one of the major driving forces behind the construction of our current clubhouse and also served on the Constitution, Life Members, Premises and Building Committees in addition to being a carnival official. Bill was awarded Life Membership at Collaroy in 1950, Branch in 1990 and State in 2001. He was awarded the Honour Blazer in 1958 and an OAM for services to Surf Life Saving and Basketball in 1995. Bill passed away in 2017 aged 91.

### **Mick Chapman Most Outstanding Under 17 Member**

Mick gained his Bronze in 1953/54 and became a member of the Club beach football team in addition to the March Past Team where he won 9 Australian gold medals. As a foundation member of the Way and Means Committee, Mick was heavily involved in trying to get the Club back on it's feet financially in the 60s and 70s. He was awarded Life Membership in 1976.

### **Neil Montgomery OAM Most Outstanding Beach Competitor**

Neil obtained his Bronze in 1947 and went on to win both the Australian beach sprint and relay in 1951. He held the positions of Vice President, Chief Instructor and President in addition to serving on the Constitution, Premises and Life Membership Committees and coaching our beach competitors. He was also a well-respected carnival official. Neil received Life Membership at Collaroy in 1971, Branch in 1980 and State in 1993 and was awarded an OAM in 1999 for services to the community, in particular to surf life saving. In 2012, he became the 7<sup>th</sup> recipient of our Club Honour Blazer. Neil passed away in 2019 aged 90.

### **Fred Hopper Memorial Shield Most Outstanding Team in Competition**

Fred Hopper had been involved in surf life saving since his teens, joining Collaroy in 1989. As Chairman of Manly Warringah Cabs, he was able to provide much needed sponsorship for the Club. Following his death in 1997, his family set up an award for the most successful team in competition

### **Mick Hogan Most Outstanding Under 19 Member**

Mick Hogan joined the Club whilst the it was in a period of rebuilding in 1983; not wanting to obtain his bronze but to help by using his business acumen. He was a very successful solicitor and he assisted Bill Goodman with generous donations quietly in the background and served on the Expenditure Review Committee from 1988 to 1999. He also had a philanthropic family client who he introduced to the Club in 1991. Douglas and Lola Douglas went on to donate IRB's, motors, radios, Nipper boards other equipment over the next few years. Mick passed away in 2019.

### **Geoff Small Most Improved U17 Member**

Geoff gained his Australian bronze in 1992 following a long association with Surf Life Saving New Zealand and in particular, Red Beach. At Collaroy, he has held the positions of Secretary, Club Captain, Vice President and International Liaison Officer. He developed our sister club relationship with Red Beach, New Zealand, of which he is a Life Member. Geoff was awarded Life Membership of Collaroy in 2008.

### **Col Newman Most Outstanding March Past Competitor**

Col obtained his Bronze in 1961/62 and would go on to be the Club's most successful March Past competitor winning around 150 medals of different colours over a time span of more than 60 years. He has held various positions including Vice Captain, Registrar, Chief Instructor and March Past Captain. He was awarded Life Membership in 2001.
